Discipline Rules

- Please read all Rules and Notes carefully. If you have any questions when entering please check with the discipline coordinator.
- Dates, programming, and changes to sections, are adjusted each year depending on entries received.

 Do not use the 2014 Programme as a guide
- Coordinators reserve the right to delete, combine or amalgamate sections.

Registration/Entries

- On-line registration will be offered again this year. A few minor changes have been made based on feedback received last year.
- If you used comps-online last year, your account and details will still be there. Your child/student details will also be there so you won't need to re-enter the details, just update and change as required.
- If this is your first time at registering online, go to: www.comps-online.com.au and click on 'Register Now' to set up an account. You will be emailed a confirmation document that activates your account.
- Entries can still be made using the forms in this booklet or by downloading hard copies from our
 website <u>www.awesightandsound.com.au</u>. All hard copy forms must be mailed to Eisteddfod Entry, PO
 Box 373, Albury 2640.
- All entries, online or postal, close on Friday 1st May 2015. Entries received after this date will incur a \$20 late fee.
- Please double check your entry before submitting as a \$10 fee will be charged for any changes made once the programme is available.
- Programmes and Season Tickets can be pre purchased online at www.comps-online.com.au

Payment

- If you enter online using <u>www.comps-online.com.au</u>, an invoice will automatically be generated and emailed to you.
- Entries can be paid for by cheque, money order or direct deposit.
- The details for direct deposit are: Hume Building Society, BSB 640 000, account no: 584730516. If paying by direct deposit, please use surname and date as a reference and keep a copy of your receipt for future queries.
- Entry fees will not be refunded where a competitor withdraws without a Doctor's certificate or does not show up for their performance.

Late entries and changes

- A late entry fee of \$20 per entry per discipline will be charged for any entry made between Saturday 2nd
 Friday 15th May 2015, ie after the closing date of 1st May
- No entries will be accepted after Friday 15th May.
- Once the programme is available, a \$10 fee will be charged for any changes or adjustments to current entries. This includes changing the style of the performance, changing the age group, changing from novice to open, or any other changes that are a result of incorrect registration.
- This fee will not be charged when Coordinators have combined sections and offered alternative sections.

Programme and Season Tickets

- The Programme will be available in early July.
- You can order and pay for a programme to be posted to you on the entry forms, including when entering online.
- Season Tickets can be pre-purchased and are \$30 per person. They can be collected when the Eisteddfod commences.
- If you do not receive your programme, please email contact@awesightandsound.com.au with your details.
- Once the programme is available, any changes will incur a \$10 fee.

Rules of the Eisteddfod

GENERAL

These rules are guidelines to facilitate the administration and logistics required in convening over several hundred events in the Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod. Please read the rules in association with Performers' Notes provided in each discipline.

- 1. All entrants listed in the programme are entitled to their performance opportunity and adjudication/critique. No performer will be "disqualified".
- 2. Under special circumstances the committee may refuse any entry.
- 3. No personal electronic devices will be allowed in the performing venue at any time. This includes but is not limited to; mobile phones, iPads/tablets, e-readers, iPods, cameras, video cameras, ds, personal computers. The use of these by members of the audience during competitions is strictly prohibited. Offenders will be removed from the venue.
- 4. The Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod Ltd is the only one authorised to use photographs or videos to promote the Eisteddfod except for parents or teachers of HSC and VCE competitors.
- 5. There is to be **NO COMMUNICATION WITH THE ADJUDICATOR** by performers, teachers or family members. Following a breach of this rule, or any other, the performer may become ineligible for an award.
- 6. The decisions of an adjudicator are final and no discussion or correspondence shall be entered into.
- 7. The Albury Wodonga Eisteddfod promotes fair and friendly competition and a high standard of behaviour from students, performers, teachers, parents and spectators is expected.
- 8. Inappropriate behaviour of any form will not be tolerated, and the Eisteddfod Committee has the right to take action on any behaviour which may be brought to its attention.
- 9. Perpetual trophies from the previous year must be returned engraved, in a clean condition to coordinators during the first week of July. Failure to do so may result in the trophies no longer being awarded or the cost of replacement passed onto the previous winner.
- 10. Performers may enter only once within a designated section.
- 11. Performers may not present the same piece or dance more than once in the Eisteddfod, unless invited to participate in a special concert or display.
- 12. If there are too few performers in a section, the co-ordinator may delete, amalgamate age groups and/or sections. Details may be shown in the programme.
- 13. Medals and other special awards will only be made where performance standards satisfy the adjudicator.
- 14. No person, including teachers or parents, will accompany performers onto the platform except as an accompanist or a conductor.
- 15. Participants must perform at the time allocated in the programme.
- 16. In accordance with the 2006 Copyright Amendment Act and APRA guidelines, performers must comply with copyright legislation. The Eisteddfod accepts no liability for copyright infringement by participants.
- 17. Mobile phones must be switched off inside the venue.

18. Standards of dress apply to all performers and must be appropriate for the occasion.

COMPLAINTS

- 1. Complaints made must be in writing. The complaint must include the complainant's full name and address, and be lodged with the Coordinator within 48 hours of the event. Such a complaint must be accompanied by a fee of \$20, which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
- 2. The Committee shall be the sole judge of disputes and its decision shall be final.

Highland Dance (as per NSWSCHDI)

- 1. Any complaint made by an individual against the Organisation or Adjudication of any event must be made in writing, giving the complainant's full name and address, and shall be lodged with the Organiser, if possible on the day of the event, and certainly not later than 48 hours after the event. Such complaint is to be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00 which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
- 2. If the complainant has not received satisfaction from the coordinator within seven days, the complaint may be referred to the Honorary Secretary, State Committee of Highland Dance Inc. Align

DANCE RULES

1. Entry and Exit from the auditorium is only permitted when a performer is NOT on stage. Further restrictions on Entry and Exit for some sections may be enforced during the Eisteddfod.

- 2. No special lighting effects are allowed. No glitter or confetti is to be dispersed on stage or into audience due to safety and theatre regulations. The curtain will remain up during the competition and will not be lowered in between performances.
- 3. No assistance by any other person/s is to be given to Performers once they have entered the Stage. Students of dance (still in training) who teach on a casual or part-time basis are <u>permitted</u> to enter the Festival and perform in sections according to their age and experience. Dancers who have any diplomas for dance many not enter this Eisteddfod, except for sections 206, 207 & 208.
- 4. Performers entering Solo sections shall only enter their own age groups, and either OPEN or NOVICE as appropriate not both.
- 5. Any performer, who has not achieved 1st or 2nd place in any eisteddfod or competition, may enter and dance as NOVICE in this Festival.
- 6. Performers who have achieved 1st or 2nd place in a specific section at any eisteddfod or competition many not enter the NOVICE category for that specific section, but may enter the OPEN category.
- 7. Any dance routine in one section many not be repeated in another section.
- 8. If only one performer is present, the award of a prize is at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 9. All electrical appliances MUST be tested and tagged as per theatre regulations.

10. <u>TIME LIMITS</u>

Solo Sections 4 minutes Song/Dance Tap otherwise 3 minutes
Duo/Trio/Quad 4 minutes Song/Dance Tap otherwise 3 minutes
All Troupe Sections 3-5 minutes
Tap Championships 4 minutes
All Other Championships 3 minutes

Improvisation 1 minute 30 seconds

Own Choreography 3 minutes

Classical Cup Minimum 2 minutes 30 Maximum 3 minutes

11. Time limits are strictly adhered to. If a performer starts on stage, time will commence when the music begins. If the performer starts off stage, time commences upon entering the stage. Adjudication will cease when the above mentioned time limits are reached.

- 12. Dance School Troupes must contain a minimum of 5 members and have the full troupe performing dance work for at least two minutes. Entries must be accompanied by a list showing names and Date of Birth of each troupe member.
- 13. Junior, Intermediate and Senior Championships must contain a minimum of 5 entries to proceed.
- 14. Primary and High School Troupes require a minimum of 5 students.
- 15. Entrants in Solo/Duo/Quad sections may appear once in that particular section.
- 16. Entrants in Troupe sections may appear more than once.
- 17. Each participant receives a pass allowing them into the auditorium for the duration of the Eisteddfod. These passes DO NOT allow entry on Troupe nights.
- 18. Music must be on a new CD or music quality cannot be assured. There should be one item per CD and should be clearly marked with the performer's name and section. Entrants are responsible for their own music.
- 19. There are to be no recorded vocals or tapping for the whole routine entered in song and dance or song and tap sections, (this includes the dance section).
- 20. Performance attire and section requirements are as follows:
 - i. Tutu must be worn in all classical solos.
 - ii. CLASSICAL BALLET CHAMPIONSHIPS: Two dances to be performed: A. Classical & B. Demi Character. To be eligible performers must perform in Classical & Demi Character Open Sections in own age group. NO REPEATS.
 - iii. TAP CHAMPIONSHIPS: A slow and fast tap to be performed without leaving the stage. To be eligible performers must perform in the Open Tap Section in own age group. NO REPEATS.
 - iv. JAZZ CHAMPIONSHIPS: Two dances to be performed. Dances are: A. Slow or Fast Jazz & B. Hip hop/funk or Musical Theatre. To be eligible, performer must perform one out of A and one out of B in their open solo sections in their own age groups. NO REPEATS.
 - v. MODERN CHAMPIONSHIPS: Two dances to be performed. Dances are: A. Neo Classical or lyrical & B. Contemporary. To be eligible, performer must perform one out of A and one out of B in their open solo sections in their own age groups. NO REPEATS.
 - vi. CLASSICAL IMPROVISATION: Plain black leotard, pink tights and pink ballet shoes. 12 yrs & under NO pointe shoes allowed.
 - vii. JAZZ IMPROVISATION: Plain black leotard, black boy leg shorts, skin coloured tights and jazz shoes.
 - viii. NEO CLASSICAL IMPROVISATION: Plain black leotard, pink tights and pink ballet shoes. 12 yrs & under NO pointe shoes allowed.
 - ix. HIP HOP/FUNK IMPROVISATION: Plain black leotard or black t-shirt, black boy leg shorts or black pants and jazz or funk shoes.
 - x. TAP IMPROVISATION: Plain black leotard, skin coloured tights and tap shoes.
 - xi. ALBURY WODONGA CLASSICAL CUP 13 years & over, performers must appear in Classical and/or Demi Character solo section. Minimum 2 minutes 30, Maximum 3 minutes. (To be a solo not a variation). In 2016 it will change to a variation and a list will be available with the Catalogue).
 - xii. BROADWAY MUSICAL: Music must be selected from a Live Broadway Production eg. Chicago then performed as in Broadway Style. Singing & Lip Syncing are permitted. Copyright permission will be required to be sighted. Please be aware that proof of what year it was performed on Broadway may be requested.
 - xiii. NURSERY RHYME: The performance must depict the storyline of a Nursery Rhyme.

- xiv. 2014 SCHOLARSHIP: We would encourage all dancers who compete in the sections required for the Scholarship to have a go, a classical background is not necessary. To be eligible for entry in the Scholarship a competitor must enter and compete in the following sections:
 - a. Improvisation of any choice discipline to be nominated by performer
 - b. Solo Own Choreography in own age group discipline to be nominated by performer
 - c. Solo of any choice discipline to be nominated by performer. To maximise your Scholarship points, enter your strongest solo section.
 - d. Any Style Solo Section. discipline to be nominated by performer
 - e. Master Class with Adjudicator. Dress attire for class is a plain black leotard or unitard, tights, ballet shoes & hair in a bun. (NO pointe shoes, wrap skirts, warm up gear or hair pieces).

Four different dance disciplines must be nominated for these sections. These must be nominated on the entry form and competitors who do not perform the discipline as nominated will become ineligible to win the Scholarship.

- 21. If a competitor leaves the stage and does not complete their performance they will not be placed and will only receive a Critique.
- 22. Any Solo performer must NOT leave the stage during their routine. Once they leave the stage the performance will be deemed over.

The Committee reserves the right to combine sections or make changes to the running of this event.

MUSIC RULES

- 1. Each performer is limited to 5 solo sections (on any one instrument) in one age group.
- 2. Own compositions etc should be submitted by 1st July.
- 3. Open age (for individual items) is 18 years and over. Even so, a performer who is 17 years old may enter Open sections.
- 3. In Vocal sections, the song/words submitted to the adjudicator must have the full musical score (i.e. not just chords).
- 4. Adjudicator copies of solo instrumental music must include the accompaniment.
- 5. All sections are own choice but time limits will be enforced. Should a time limit be exceeded items may be terminated or abbreviated by the adjudicator (without prejudice to the performers).

 Adjudication will cease when the time limits are reached.
- 6. Repeats in instrumental sections should be avoided.
- 7. In vocal sections a maximum of three verses should be sung where these are melodically the same.
- 8. Clothing: This will respect the expectations of the adjudicator and the sense of occasion.
- 9. All performers (or group) must have at least one original copy of the music they are presenting.
- 10. **CHOIRS, ORCHESTRAS & BANDS** two teacher passes will be issued per school. All other helpers/volunteers for that school must pay the entry fee into the venue.
- 11. **HSC/VCE SECTIONS** Performers must be studying music for the HSC/VCE. Teachers or parents are permitted to video their own student/child for training purposes only.
- 12. **INDIVIDUAL SECTIONS** if there are two or less entrants, the section may be deleted, or amalgamated into 'Own Choice', or amalgamated with another age group. This will be up to the Coordinator's decision. This rule applies to both instrumental and vocal sections.
- 13. **AGE AGGREGATES** To be eligible for an age aggregate, entrants must perform in **three** styles of the one instrument/voice. For aggregates; performers will be awarded 5 points for each 1st place, 3 points for each 2nd place, 2 points for each 3rd place, and 1 point for each highly commended. - 1. All items other than set pieces are candidate's own choice.
- 2. Set Pieces Scripture Reading and Choral Speaking are available from Jan Skinner.
- 3. **Copies of all selections** typed and properly punctuated and marked: "NOT SUBJECT TO COPYRIGHT" must be handed in to the coordinator by **Saturday** 18th **July 2015**. Prepared readings need not be submitted.
- 4. No entrant is permitted to perform the same item they have previously performed at an AWE Eisteddfod.
- 5. **Choral Speaking** Choir members may perform in only one choir in the same section.
- 6. **Scripture Readings** are taken from the King James Bible. Competitors are to supply their own Bible and read directly from the Bible.
- 7. In all Improvisation Sections a warning bell will be given one minute prior to the concluding time.
- 8. Maximum time limits are stated beside each event. In all Intermediate, Senior and Open sections, time limits are enforced. A bell will ring when the time limit is reached and performers must finish at the end of the current sentence. Performers who do not finish on the bell become ineligible for an award, but are still entitled to their adjudication. The bell rule will not be used for any Junior Sections, however selections should not exceed 3 minutes.
- 9. Costumes and props are only permitted in Character Recitals, Duologues, Unscripted Play-building, and One Act Plays. A single chair may be used in other sections if required, however no costumes (or part thereof) or props are permitted in any individual sections.
- 10. Performances may be photographed or taped for AWE Festival archives or promotions.
- 11. If there is only one entrant in any **Individual Section**, the section will be deleted or amalgamated with the next age group, where possible. This rule does not apply to Group Sections or 6 Years and Under Sections
- 12. **Championship Recital** must contain a minimum of four competitors competing on the day for the section to proceed. If however, an entrant is sick on the day and unable to compete and a Doctor's Certificate is submitted, the section will go ahead.

- Championship Recital Performers must undertake both sections, Lyrical Recital and Selection from a Play, and must introduce and link their pieces to demonstrate a theme. Time limit for this section is: minimum 5 minutes, maximum 8 minutes, including links.
- **Choral Speaking** Choirs will be required to present the Set Piece and another of their own choosing that contrasts with the Set Piece. Stands are not provided but may be used.
- **Story Telling** Competitors will be given the beginning of a sentence which they must use to begin their story; or a theme which they use to create their story. This is the Adjudicator's choice.
- Unscripted Play-Building A performance that has been developed by the students involved in the performance. It may be costumed, have a simple set, and sound effects and lighting if provided by the performance group. Adjudication is based on entertainment value, the evident level of student development of the piece as well as performance and stage skills. Time limits will be enforced.
- One Act Plays Minimum number of performers is 3. Five minutes is allowed to set up and five minutes to strike the stage. Marks will be awarded for literary value.
- **HSC/VCE SECTIONS** Performers must be studying drama for the HSC/VCE. Teachers or parents are permitted to video their own student/child for training purposes only.

- No Copies of a script or part of a script are allowed on stage in any section. They may not be included as part of props, sets or costumes.
- Prepared Reading Must be read directly from the original book.
- Humorous Verse /Prose May be a monologue selection.
- Own Choice Selection Junior (12 years and Under) through to Open Sections must **NOT** be

Humorous Recitals.
