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Rules of Competition

Entries

- All entries must be made online.
- Late entries will not be accepted; however, in exceptional circumstances the Committee MAY accept late entries up to and including one week after entries close. A late fee of \$20 per entry will apply.

1. Definitions

- 1.1 For the purposes of the Eisteddfod, a competitor's age shall mean their age on the advertised opening date of the Eisteddfod. Competitors in age-limited events must be prepared to submit proof of age by Birth Certificate or other means if required to do so.
- 1.2 **Open** means the event is open to all competitors of any age **unless otherwise stated**.
- 1.3 **Restricted** events are open only to competitors who have not won a solo event for that category of instrument **(including voice)** or speech and drama in a previous eisteddfod at Armidale or elsewhere.
- 1.4 **Novice** events are open only to competitors who have been learning that category of instrument **(including voice)** for 18 months or less prior to close of entries.
- 1.5 **Small country school** events are open only to school groups from schools outside Armidale having a school population of fewer than 100 pupils.
- 1.6 **School groups** must consist only of members of that school.

2. Before an Event

- 2.1 Music or scripts for the Adjudicator must be handed to the Music/Script Coordinator at least 15 minutes before the start of the event. Competitors who fail to do so may be disqualified.
- 2.2 Competitors must fill out the Copyright Declaration form ONCE for the whole Eisteddfod. The form is available through the main menu of the Eisteddfod website. The completed form must be handed in prior to a competitor's first event.
- 2.3 The TITLE, COMPOSER/AUTHOR and the COMPETITOR'S NAME, EVENT NUMBER and COMPETITOR'S NUMBER must be clearly visible on the music or script.

3. Conditions of entry

- 3.1 A competitor may enter a particular solo event twice provided a different instrument is played for each performance (e.g. trumpet, trombone).
- 3.2 Unless stated otherwise the competitor shall select pieces to be performed.
- 3.3 A competitor shall not perform the same item in more than one event during the Eisteddfod. **The exceptions are KB45 and KB46 - Collaborative Pianist.**
- 3.4 A competitor must not repeat any item performed in a previous Armidale Eisteddfod until three years have passed.
- 3.5 Where events refer to an AMEB Grade (or equivalent) it is presumed that the competitor is currently playing at that standard. It is not intended that a competitor play a piece at a lower level than their current standard. Notwithstanding the above, a competitor MAY play a piece at a higher level than their current standard.

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- 3.6 The Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any event where insufficient entries are received. If, for any reason, an event is cancelled competitors may seek a refund of the entry fee.
- 3.7 All special requests must be made at the time of entry.
- 3.8 The order of events may be changed **only** at the discretion of the Committee or Coordinator.
- 3.9 The order of competitors within an event may be changed **only** at the discretion of the Committee or Coordinator.
- 3.10 Competitors not answering their names when it is their turn to perform in an event may be disqualified.
- 3.11 Under special circumstances, the Coordinator may allow a competitor to perform out of the event. He or she will receive adjudication but no placing.
- 3.12 It is the responsibility of the competitor to make arrangements with an accompanist **at least three weeks** prior to the performance, and to negotiate fees with the accompanist.
- 3.13 For the New England Championship event MX16 there must be at least 4 entries, of whom at least 3 must perform for the event to run. If only 1 or 2 of the entrants turn up they may perform but will only receive adjudication, with no prize money or placing.
Any other event, **including Section Championships**, will require at least 3 contestants to perform for prize money to be awarded.
- 3.14 Prize money is payable by EFT. Winners are requested to supply their bank details no later than one month after winning a cash prize. Cash prizes need to be finalised no later than 31st July 2026 or may be forfeited. It is the applicant and entrant's responsibility to ensure that all banking information provided is accurate. AES will not accept responsibility for any effect arising from incorrect or mistaken bank details.

4. Duet and Trio Events

- 4.1 In duet or trio items the names of the individual partners must be stated **at the time of entry**. In the event of one partner being unable to perform due to a genuine change in circumstance, the Committee may allow a substitute provided that notice is given to the Entry Coordinator before the start of the session.
- 4.2 An individual may enter a duet or trio event with different partners and/or different instruments. The maximum number of times an individual can enter the same duet or trio event is two.

5. Time Limits

- 5.1 Where there is no stated time limit, the Adjudicator reserves the right to terminate a competitor's performance at any stage. This does not mean disqualification or disapproval.
- 5.2 Time limits in all events must be strictly observed. A warning bell may be rung when the time limit is reached. A further bell may be rung 15 seconds after the finishing time. At this point the competitor must leave the stage.

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6. Choirs and Speech & Drama Specific Rules

- 6.1 **In High School and Open events** conductors must not sing or speak when conducting choral speech, choral singing or instrumental groups.
- 6.2 In speech and drama events teachers are not to prompt, direct or coach behind the stage.
- 6.3 All props for Speech and Drama events are to be provided by competitors. There will be no specialist lighting and lighting is limited to on and blackout.
- 6.4 A competitor is permitted to use another person (other than his/her teacher) as prompt, if necessary, in the following Speech and Drama events:
 - Solo character sketch
 - Dramatic extract or short play
 - Verse speaking
 - Prose recital
 - Humorous prose or verse

Prompts must have their own copies of the scripts and be seated inconspicuously to the left or right of the performing space. Prompting will result in lower marks.

7. Music Events

- 7.1 Unless performing from memory, all competitors must perform from the original copy.
- 7.2 If performing from memory, the original music must be handed to the Music Coordinator to be passed on to the Adjudicator.
- 7.3 If a photocopy is required for the Adjudicator or accompanist, the original music must still be shown to the Music Coordinator. The Copyright Declaration Form must be completed.
- 7.4 **The use of backing tracks is not allowed except in rare circumstances where the original music is not available to purchase.**

8. Judging and Disputes

- 8.1 The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 8.2 If a satisfactory standard is not achieved, the award of first or any place will be left to the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 8.3 Where equal places are awarded any prizes for that place are to be shared between award winners.
- 8.4 The Adjudicator has the authority of the Committee to terminate a performance if it is considered offensive in any way.
- 8.5 Any person who is related to or has been taught or coached privately by an appointed Adjudicator during the 12 months preceding the opening date of the Eisteddfod will not be in contention for a prize or placing and will be eligible for 'comments only'.
- 8.6 Communication with the Adjudicator by competitors, teachers or other interested parties is strictly forbidden. All enquiries must be made to the Eisteddfod Coordinator. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.

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- 8.7 All protests must be in writing and lodged with the Eisteddfod Coordinator within one hour of the conclusion of the session containing the item to which the protest relates.
- 8.8 The Committee shall be the sole judge of disputes and its decision shall be final.

9. Recording of Performances and Publicity

- 9.1 The use of cameras or recording devices at our venues and events is prohibited. However, parents may take **STILL** images **only** of their own children performing in Solo sections without the use of flash and providing it does not **affect the performance or the audience**.
- 9.2 All electronic devices should either be turned off or on Silent mode.
- 9.3 AES may publicise the name, profile and photograph of an entrant in Eisteddfod publications and results, via electronic, social and printed media at its discretion.

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Entering the 2026 Armidale Eisteddfod

By your entering the 2026 Armidale Eisteddfod it is assumed that you have read and understood the Terms and Conditions of Entry.

Acccompanists need to be organised well in advance.

Your entry MUST be lodged by 5:00 pm, Friday 20th March 2026.

All entries to the Armidale Eisteddfod are to be done online. The process allows you to complete all components of your entry, including payment.

The online system was set up to encourage Eisteddfod participants and/or their families to make entries on their own behalf for individual and small group events. This will mean contestants will need to communicate with their teachers and other performers very clearly before submitting their entries.

School groups will be entered, also online, by the schools themselves.



Fees for 2026 are set at:

- All Championship events (except Speech & Drama) - \$23.45 per competitor
- Music events (choirs & other groups) - \$35.70 per group
- Music events (solo competitors) - \$12.00 per competitor
- Music events (duos & trios) - \$11.75 per competitor
- Composition – Years K-6 \$23.50 per entry
- Composition – Years 7-8 \$23.50 per entry
- Composition – Years 9-10 \$23.50 per entry

- Composition – Years 11-12 \$28.90 per entry
- Composition – Open \$34.70 per entry

There will be no administration fee or charge for the Program. All competitors will have full access to the online program prior to the beginning of the Eisteddfod.

One or two contrasting pieces.

CH02 - Choir, non-competitive

One or two contrasting pieces. (Infants (K-2) should enter CH01).

CH03 - Choir, small country schools

Two contrasting pieces.

Years K-6

First prize - \$100

The National Party Perpetual Shield is awarded to the small country school with the **highest total score across events**

CH03, SD46 and EN02. All 3 events are held in the same session. Only competitors entering all three events are eligible for this shield

CH04 - Choir, unison

Two contrasting pieces. One set piece plus one own choice. **The set piece must be selected from a number of specified pieces.** Details available from the NECOM office or by emailing iroobol@as.edu.au

Years 10 & under

One own choice piece. Time limit of 6 minutes.

19 years & under

One own choice piece. Time limit of 6 minutes.

CH09 - Vocal Ensemble

19 years & under

Maximum of 20 singers. Two contrasting pieces. Time limit of 6 minutes.

First prize - \$100 and The Armidale Locksmiths Perpetual Shield

CH10 - New England Choral

Open

Championship

Two contrasting pieces with a minimum of 3 parts. Time limit of 10 minutes.

First prize - \$200 and The Cecil Hill Memorial Shield.

CH11 - Choir, non-competitive

Open

One or two contrasting pieces. Community & school groups. Time limit of 6 minutes.

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Ensembles

Class ensembles (EN01 to EN08)

- ★ All students must be in the same roll or elective class.
- ★ Teacher accompaniment allowed for Years K-6 only.
- ★ For Years 7-12, any accompaniment must be provided by a student member of the ensemble.
- ★ Recorded accompaniment not allowed.
- ★ Any combination of singing and instruments allowed, unless otherwise stated.
- ★ Time limit of 3 minutes, unless otherwise stated.
- ★ Age restrictions will be strictly enforced for all events.

First prize - \$75 and the Robyn & Bill Driscoll Perpetual Shield.

KB49 - New England Piano Grade 7 & 8 level

Championship

One movement (not a slow movement) from a Classical or Romantic sonata or sonatina played from memory. To qualify, competitor needs to have performed in two other piano events.

First prize - \$100

KB50 - New England Piano

Championship (23 Years and under)

One movement (not a slow movement) from a Classical or Romantic sonata or sonatina played from memory. To qualify, competitor needs to have performed in two other piano events.

First prize - \$100 and the John Hadfield (Armidale & NF Piano Tuning) Perpetual Shield.

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Mature Performers

In addition to the rules listed under *Rules of Competition* and *Copyright Laws* in the Syllabus the following additional rules shall apply.

1. The Mature Performers section is age restricted: all entrants must be **at least 30 years of age**.
2. All sections are non-competitive. Each entrant will receive a written report from the Adjudicator.
3. Each item must consist of one piece only.

At the end of the evening's performance the Adjudicator may select the most entertaining performance of the evening for inclusion in the Gala Concert.

MP1 - To tell a tall story, solo

Time limit 5 minutes

MP2 - Poetry, solo

Own composition or selection from a published work. Time limit 5 minutes

MP3 - A spoken piece, solo

Time limit 5 minutes

MP4 – Vocal, solo

Time limit 5 minutes

MP5 - Vocal duo, trio or quartet

Time limit 5 minutes

MP6 - Instrumental, solo

Any instrument including piano. Time limit 5 minutes

MP7 - Instrumental ensemble

2 – 4 players of any combination. Time limit 5 minutes

MP8 - Mature novice, solo

Learning less than five years. Time limit 5 minutes.

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Stage 6 (HSC) Music

**THIS SESSION IS FOR STUDENTS, THEIR PARENTS AND THEIR TEACHERS ONLY.
VIDEOING FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES BY THE STUDENT'S TEACHER ONLY**

This section will be run in a dedicated workshop session on Sunday May 17th at 10.00am at NECOM. Stage 6 teachers are welcome to attend. The section is non-competitive and each item shall consist of a single work and may include pieces that have been performed in this year's Eisteddfod.

A timekeeper will be appointed to ensure performers keep to the appropriate time limit.

Time will be allowed at the end of each performance for a brief interactive discussion amongst the performer, adjudicator and audience members.

Each entrant will receive written feedback from the adjudicator.

Any style of work from the competitor's Preliminary program on any instrument (including Piano and Voice)

Time limit 5 minutes

Any style of work from the competitor's HSC program on any instrument (including Piano and Voice)

HSC03 – Music 1, HSC Course

Time limit 5 minutes

HSC04 – Music 2 (Core), HSC Course

Time limit 5 minutes

HSC05 – Music 2 (Elective), HSC Course

Time limit 7 minutes

3. Works are to be composed by the individual competitor (except students in Years K-6 who may submit either individual or group entries).
4. Each composition must consist of a written score and a recording of the composition. The score must be legible and may be either hand-written or printed. The recording should be an .mp3 file and submitted via USB or email [Andrew French-Northam at NECOM \(andrew@necom.org.au\)](mailto:Andrew.French-Northam@NECOM.org.au). The recording should give a good indication of the intended sound of the work but the quality of the recorded performance is not a major factor in the adjudicator's decision.
5. **Performance time limits are:** Years K-10 - 2 minutes, Years 11-12 - 3 minutes, and Open - 6 minutes.
6. Compositions may be for any medium.
7. A brief written declaration stating that the composition is the competitor's own work must accompany each entry. It must be signed by the competitor and a teacher or a parent.
8. Short-listed composers for each event will be informed. They will be requested to attend the Composition Awards Night and make arrangements for performing their piece. Only compositions which are performed live will be considered for a place. A Highly Commended award may be presented to compositions presented electronically only, i.e. not performed. Competitors should take this rule into consideration when composing their piece.
9. At the conclusion of the Workshop, the Elena Kats-Chernin Prize (framed music) for best overall composition will be announced. The winner is selected by the adjudicator from all First Prize winners across events MC01 to MC08.
10. If a competitor withdraws before submission of the composition a refund may be sought.





Where photocopies are used for a performance they must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher or copyright holder. Schools may use AMCOS-stamped copies in accordance with AMCOS agreement.
- 1.4 The OneMusic Copyright Declaration Form will be available at the eisteddfod venues and is available online. The competitor, parent, guardian or teacher may complete this form.
- 1.5 A copy of work (music or printed word) must be provided for the adjudicator.
- 1.6 Photocopies made for adjudication purposes will be destroyed after the event by the Eisteddfod Committee.
- 1.7 Recordings of music used by competitors must be original, legally purchased and/or clearly endorsed with an AMCOS license number.

2. Speech and Drama Events

- 2.1 An exception (Section 45) in the Copyright Act permits a reading or recitation in public of an extract of reasonable length from a published literary or dramatic work, or from an adaption, if the work is sufficiently acknowledged.
- 2.2 You may photocopy a work or edition that is protected by copyright for use in the Eisteddfod. The Eisteddfod Committee destroys all photocopies after the event. You are not required to complete any forms.

3. Instructions

- 3.1 The OneMusic Copyright Declaration Form needs to be completed once for the whole Eisteddfod and is to be handed in at a competitor's first performance and filed.
- 3.2 Prior to each event, all competitors must be able to show the Music/Script Coordinator the original music or script from which photocopies for adjudication purposes have been made.
