AGE

Age for entries is taken at 1st January 2021

PAYMENT OF PRIZES

Winners of cash prizes will no longer be paid by cheque but by Direct Deposit to their bank account. Winners will be given a form to fill in with their bank details. This is then given to the Section Co-ordinator, before the winner leaves the theatre. These forms will be destroyed when payment is made.

ENTRY FEES Please note that the increases to our entry fees have been made necessary by the increases that we must pay to APRA for each piece that is performed in all of our musical sections.

ENTRIES CLOSE SUNDAY 14 March 2021

OUT OF SESSION PLAYING

We understand that school activities such as excursions or exams can clash with eisteddfod events. In these situations a competitor may play at another time and receive an adjudicator's report but will not be eligible for awards. Arrangements will need to be made with co-ordinators before the commencement of the piano sections.

DONATIONS FOR AWARDS

Most of the money from entry fees goes towards the running of the Eisteddfod, e.g. hire of venue, employment of adjudicator. We ask you to consider donating an amount for awards in our Piano Sections. You may wish to choose a specific section or make a general contribution or think big and donate the prize money for a championship section. Please indicate your wishes on the entry form. All donations are greatly appreciated.

AWARDS

CHAMPIONSHIPS

To be eligible for this section, you must perform in two other solo sections.

In the championship section you must perform two solos. One solo will be a classical composition from any period. The other solo has no restriction but must display a distinct contrast.

First Prize Awards:

Junior Championship12 years and under\$200Intermediate Championship16 years and under\$300Senior Championship17 years and over\$400

ROMA LIGGINS SCHOLARSHIP

A \$1500 scholarship will be given to one outstanding performer in the 2020 Eisteddfod.

One performer will be chosen by the adjudicators from each of the five disciplines of the Eisteddfod. The Management Committee of the Taree and District Eisteddfod Society will then choose one of these five to be the successful recipient of the award. This will be announced at the Grand Concert. A special award of \$400 will go to each of the four not awarded the Scholarship.

DENVA BIRD MEMORIAL TROPHY

This is awarded by the adjudicator to the most promising pianist. There is also a \$250 cash award.

JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR ENCOURAGEMENT AWARDS

Junior - 12 years and under. Intermediate - 16 years and under. Senior - 17 years and over

A perpetual and replica trophy are awarded for each level. There are also \$50, \$75, \$100 cash awards respectively.

AGGREGATE POINT SCORE

In each age category the winner receives a medal. Overall winner receives a trophy.

CANTEEN SCHOLARSHIP

An award of \$300 for tuition.

MIDCOAST WATER ENCOURAGEMENT AWARDS

Several awards will be given to promising performers.

SMILE SCHOLARSHIPS

A number of Smile Scholarships will be awarded by the adjudicator to very talented performers in the Piano Section. These are to be used to further in some special way the musical studies of the recipient. They could be used for such events as Summer Schools, attendance at Masterclasses or to purchase much needed equipment.

THE GRAND CONCERT

Selections of performers are made by the section co-ordinator and in some instances by the concert organiser, in collaboration with the co-ordinator.

Performers for the Grand Concerts are selected from:- Championship and Scholarship winners, multiple place winners, and other one-off high standard and entertaining performances to represent all disciplines of the Eisteddfod.

There is a maximum number of performers selected from each discipline, in order to keep each concert to 3 hours. Maximum numbers may vary each year.

Performers chosen for the concerts should contact the concert organiser.

Sections 158 to 163 Piano Ensemble

In 2017 we introduced a revamped piano duet section named **Piano Ensemble.** This proved to be a great success with many entries being received. These sections will run again this year with the same format.

The sections are noncompetitive, have no entry fee and are extremely flexible in their structure. Basically it is a chance for one performer to play in ensemble with any other musician or musicians. Adjudicator reports for the performances will be available.

A few guidelines:

Enter one **Performer**.

Performer will play in an ensemble with a **Partner** or **Partners**. **Partner/s** don't need to be nominated on the entry form. **Partner/s** may be of any age.

Partner/s may be any person including the Performer's teacher or parent.

Partner/s may play more than once. This is especially for teachers who may want to partner several of their students.

The Ensemble may be:

Performer as one of the players in a piano duet or trio

Performer with one or more vocalists

Performer with one or more other instrumentalists

Section 171 Set Work

To mark our **50th** Anniversary Year in 2017 we introduced a new special Section. This took the form of a set work. We commissioned Andrew Chubb to compose a new work for this section.

We are very grateful to Peter and Louise Rourke for providing the commission fee.

Andrew is a composer, performer and teacher based in Newcastle. As a boy growing up in Taree, he competed in this Eisteddfod over the course of many years.

Over the past three years Andrew has given us three waltzes. He is currently creating a set of these waltzes and hopes to offer us at least one new one for 2021. The previous three will still be available for performance in this section in 2021.

Everyone should enter under the one section number and entrants will be sorted into ages once entries have been collated.
