Competition is staged with respect for the organisers, audience, adjudicator/s and fellow competitors, thereby maintaining the spirit and integrity of the eisteddfod movement.

2025 Music Schedule - Changes

Please note that the Music Schedule has been reviewed and as a result there have been changes to some of the usual information found in the Music Schedule.

All teachers & competitors are encouraged to read through the Music Schedule in its entirety to be aware of any changes to sections and to rules / conditions. Specifically, please note the following:-

- Copies of own choice music are to be uploaded electronically to Music Uploads rather than submitted via hard copy. Likewise, those with recorded accompaniments will need to upload these recordings electronically to Music Uploads.
- Some new sections are included such as contemporary vocal sections; small vocal ensemble sections; a piano accompany section; and a family item. Age based piano solos have been refined slightly and age based instrumental solos have been grouped according to instrument families. Additionally, we are excited to be able to offer some cash/voucher prizes for some sections in the 2025 competition.
- In relation to Conditions and Rules, while no substantial changes have been made, we'd like to draw your attention to the following conditions to ensure they are followed by competitors, conductors and teachers in 2025 (and beyond):-
 - Time limits: please observe limits as performances will not be adjudicated after the allotted time
 - Conducting and prompting is not permitted except for the sections indicated in Condition 24.
 - Contemporary vocal competitors are to use a microphone see Condition 29.

ENTRIES CLOSE: 28th March 2025 (11.00pm AEST) Late entries are not accepted after the closing date.

Please ensure you read the Rules and Conditions of Entry and agree to them online. Your entry will not be able to be finalised until this is done.

Please complete all your section entries in one application (e.g., ensure your piano sections, vocal sections & instrumental sections are made all in the one online entry). An online booking fee (\$5.00) is payable for each entry form submitted through comps-online.

Payments must be made at the time of completing the entry. Entries will not be valid and will not be processed until payment has been received. Payment options for comps-online include PayPal or Credit Card. Please contact the coordinator if you are unable to utilise these payment options.

If your registration is successful, you will receive an email from Comps-Online. If you do not receive an email within one hour (inbox / spam mail folders), contact Comps-Online Technical Support on (03) 9841 5940. (The invoice number in this email is verification of your entry.)

Music Uploads

Instructions for Submitting Own Choice Selections and Backing Tracks

Uploads required by 19th May 2025.

Any recorded accompaniment and copies of own choice music for all solo, duet/trio/quartets, ensembles and group items are to be uploaded via www.musicuploads.com.au



- 1. View the Music Uploads Videos Music Uploads YouTube Channel
- 2. Create an Account (if you do not already have one) or Reactivate your Account (if you have previously used Music Uploads).
- 3. Add the Region (Competition) you will need to pay for each competition you add.
- 4. Upload Files to Storage
- 5. Transfer the Files to the Region (Competition)
- 6. Create or Search for a Performer and review that all entries are correct.
- 7. Transfer the files for the Performer
- 8. Check your Files ensure it is the correct music; and for uploads of adjudicator copies of music, please ensure the document file includes the "Identification Form for all Own Choice selections" (see end of schedule) and the Copyright Declaration Form. Check all pages are the correct way up.
- 9. If you wish to withdraw an entry, please use that option in Music Uploads and our team will be notified.

Music Uploads will be open for your transfer of files from 10th May to 19th May 2025. Please follow our Facebook page for reminders to upload.

Rules & Conditions

Please ensure that teachers and competitors read the following rules and conditions, including the Release and Indemnity section.

In placing an entry in the Eisteddfod you are deemed to have accepted these conditions.

General Eisteddfod Rules & Conditions

- 1. All competition is open to amateurs only. The term 'amateur' means one whose principal source of income is not derived from the exercise of their talent in the particular class for which they may have entered. This condition does not apply to conductors and accompanists.
- 2. Student teachers presently studying or teaching under the guidance of a professional teacher are classified as amateur.
- 3. Age of the competitor is as at 31 December 2025. The committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor to provide a birth certificate or copy thereof, and to withhold any prize until the certificate is received. Open sections are for competitors aged 19 and over.
- 4. The committee encourages performance for competition rather than performances for adjudication only or performance only. The only exception to this may occur when Conditions of entry are breached.
- 5. Breaches of rules and conditions may result in the disqualification or the withholding of prizes. The decision of the committee on any question or dispute shall be final.
- 6. All entries are to be submitted through Comps-Online. Entry fees are non-refundable unless the Committee cancels the event, in which case the registration fee less the booking and administration fees, will be refunded.
- 7. Time limits indicated in the schedule must not be exceeded. Competitors will not be adjudicated after the specified time limit has elapsed.
- 8. Beginners' sections are for those with a maximum learning time 18 months by 26 May 2025.
- 9. The Kingaroy Eisteddfod Committee shall have full control of the program at all times and reserves the right to alter or amend the program; refuse entry; cancel any section if there are insufficient entries or to combine or split sections based on entries. The Committee is not responsible for errors or omissions in submitted entries. The Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute Adjudicator should this become necessary.
- 10. The program will run as published unless prior arrangements are made with the Coordinator. No competitor may perform out of programmed sequence without approval of the Coordinator.
- 11. Communication with the Adjudicator by teachers, parents/guardians or competitors during the Eisteddfod is not permitted, unless requested by the adjudicator. The adjudicator's decision shall be final, except if some error in identity has occurred, then the committee shall have the power to decide.
- 12. No prize will be awarded where the Adjudicator considers merit insufficient, and all prizes are awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator. Adjudicator's remark sheets will be available to all competitors from the Officials Desk.
- 13. Protests must be made in writing and lodged at the Official Desk within half an hour of results being announced or the cause of protest arising, accompanied by a fee of \$30 which will be forfeited if the protest is considered frivolous or proved wrong. The Protest Committee's decision shall be final.

Rules & Conditions (cont'd)

- 14. Competitors are not permitted to practice on stage during an Eisteddfod without the express permission of the co-ordinator.
- 15. No parents/guardians or teachers are permitted onstage, backstage or in the marshalling area at any time unless in the capacity of an accompanist, conductor, instrument tuner, page turner or working in a volunteer capacity, to assist the smooth running of the program.
- 16. The Kingaroy Eisteddfod does not have an official accompanist. Competitors requiring an accompanist should make their own arrangements.
- 17. Competitors choosing to use a recorded backing must ensure the recorded backing does not have vocals in any part (lead, backing or harmony). Recorded backings are to be uploaded using Music Uploads. All backing tracks will be played through the venue sound system. Please bring a backup copy of the recorded backing in the rare case there is a problem with the music.
- 18. All own choice music (PDF's) is to be electronically uploaded using Music Uploads, for use by the Adjudicator. Please ensure all music is submitted (in the correct page order and the correct way up) with a completed Identification Form and a Copyright Declaration Form.
- 19. Competitors, accompanists, parents/guardians & teachers should ensure compliance with copyright laws for both sheet music and recorded backings.

Competitors in the Kingaroy Eisteddfod will perform:-

- a) From an original published edition of the sheet music; or
- b) From a photocopy, transcription or arrangement of sheet music that is accompanied by a letter from the music publisher authorizing the use of the photocopy, transcription or arrangement; or
- c) From sheet music where both the work and edition are out of copyright (composer/lyricist/arranger all died before 1955 and the edition publication date was more than 25 years ago)
- d) By ear.
- The Kingaroy Eisteddfod Committee will not be liable for any copyright infringements relating to the use of copies should they occur.
- 20. Perpetual Trophies and Shields will be presented to the winner/s on the day, but will be retained by the Kingaroy Eisteddfod Inc.
- 21. Care will be taken to ensure the safety of all competitors, but Kingaroy Eisteddfod Inc will not be responsible for any injuries sustained by a competitor, or damage to property during an Eisteddfod. All competitors enter the Eisteddfod and take part in the Eisteddfod at their own risk and are responsible for their own belongings.

Rules & Conditions (cont'd)

Specific Conditions for Music Sections

- 22. All competitors in sections with ten or more performers will need to make their own arrangements for any stage set up.
- 23. All music sections are Own Choice, unless otherwise indicated. Competitors may not use Own Choice music selections with which they have gained a prize in a previous Kingaroy Eisteddfod, nor may they use a piece of music more than once in the same Eisteddfod.
- 24. Conducting and prompting is not permitted in any section, except for bands (B1-B7) and choirs (C1-C5). Conductors who sing with their ensembles are considered to be prompting and are therefore in breach of this rule.
- 25. Age Sections (Non-Championship sections) Piano & Instrumental
 - a) The Age section of the competition is open to non-graded performers only (i.e., Non-Championship performers). The term "non-graded" refers to those not entered in graded sections for that particular instrument. Teachers of an instrument are not permitted to enter the aged or open sections for that instrument.
 - b) The age of the competitor will be as at 31st December 2025.
- 26. Graded Sections (Championship sections) Piano & Instrumental
 - a) Competitors may select any piece from the list of any recognised examining body, or the equivalent;
 - b) Competitors must not have passed any higher exam level than the one in which they are competing;
 - c) No age limits apply;
 - d) Anyone competing in the graded sections is not permitted to compete in aged sections;
 - e) A competitor may not enter into the same graded section for more than two (2) successive years

27. Duets, Trios, Quartets

- a) All competitors, Group Names, School Names or Performance Names must be nominated in the entry. The words "and partner" will not be accepted;
- b) In duets, trios and quartets, the age of the oldest competitor determines the age group in which the competitors will compete. The remaining competitors may be younger;
- c) Any combination of voices/instruments allowed. All items must show part work.

28. Bands, Ensembles and Orchestras

- a) Piano or any accompanying instrument may be included in these sections, provided the accompanist is of the required age group for the section.
- b) In Primary School ensembles and orchestras, the accompanist may be an adult. A recorded accompaniment/backing track is permitted;
- c) Maximum of two (2) pieces may be performed.
- 29. Contemporary Vocal Sections must be performed with a microphone which will be provided. Any backing accompaniment may be used. See further Condition 17 and 30.
- 30. The use of explicit language is prohibited. Singers should avoid items of an overtly sexual or undignified nature. Repertoire/song choices should reasonably reflect the age of the singer and their capabilities. Make-up, costumes and choice of songs should be suitable to the age of the singer and sexually explicit actions avoided.

Release and Indemnity

The Competitor, or their Parent/Guardian or Teacher confirms that by entering this competition, they acknowledge that:

- 1. Competing in the Kingaroy Eisteddfod Competition involves risk of injury which may be of a serious nature and property loss or damage which may occur;
- 2. The Competitor is not covered by any insurance policy while competing or warming up for the competition;
- The Competitor enters into the Kingaroy Eisteddfod Competition at their own risk and will satisfy themselves as to the safety of the competition area and surface to be used by the Competitor;
- 4. The Competitor will follow all directions and set rules stated by the competition organiser or persons authorised by them and waives any claims for liability against any organiser, (whether an Association or individual), participant, official, steward, judge, visitor, employee, or invitee (the "participants") and releases the participants from all liability that may arise out of the competition, to the Competitor. Such liability shall include any personal injury, property loss or damage;
- 5. The Competitor, Parent/Guardian or Teachers warrants that they have read and understood these rules and have signed them of their own free will. If they are not satisfied in anyway with the rules or the standard of the competition area or any of the facilities, then they are not obliged to compete;
- 6. Where the Competitor is under the age of 18 years, Parent/Guardian or Teacher is authorised to agree on the Competitor's behalf, having satisfied themselves that the Competitor understands the nature and effects of these rules before doing so.

SOUTH BURNETT MUSIC TROPHY will be awarded to a competitor who is a school student residing in the South Burnett. This achievement award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's five (5) highest scores in the Music Sections.

Junior Solo 14 years and under (born 2011 and later). This Championship Award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's four (4) highest scores in the Junior Vocal Sections [Sections V2 - V18]

Senior Solo (Sponsored by Ann Butwell) 15 to 18 years (born 2007 to 2010). This Championship Award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's four (4) highest scores in the Senior Vocal Sections [Sections V20 - V25]

Open Solo (Sponsored by Taabinga Homestead) 19 years and over (born 2006 and earlier). This Championship Award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's four (4) highest scores in the Open Vocal Sections [Sections V27 - V32]

Advanced Piano Championship (Sponsored by Kingaroy RSL) Will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's four (4) highest scores in the Piano Sections Grades 5 to 8 solo items. Competitors must have entered Quick Study or Sight Reading or both [Sections P61 – P84]

Greenacres Elementary Trophy (Sight Reading and Quick Study) This Championship Award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's scores for Piano Sections:

a) P35 and P36 or

Hahn Family Trophy (Sight Reading and Quick Study) This Championship Award will be calculated on the aggregate of the Competitor's scores for Piano Sections:

Definitions

POPULAR: Songs that have been widely circulated and commercially promoted

SACRED: A song of a reverent or spiritual nature

MUSICAL THEATRE: Any song from a musical stage production, film or television using the

composed arrangement

FOLK: A song originating among the people of a country or area, or a song of similar character written by a known composer

JAZZ (includes Rags and Blues): A style of music, characterized by a strong but flexible rhythmic under structure

BAROQUE: 1600 to 1750

CLASSICAL STYLE: 1750 - 1830

ROMANTIC: 1820 - 1910

CONTEMPORARY: 1900 – current

AUSTRALIAN SONG: An own choice song by a published or unpublished Australian

Composer

ARIA: A self - contained piece for one voice. Typically, from Opera, Oratorio, Cantata.

ORATORIO: Is a large scale work based on a sacred subject. An Aria from any Oratorio, Mass or Bach Cantata (Secular cantatas allowed). Preceding recitative and da capo sections must be sung. Must be sung in the original language.

CANTATA: A Choral composition, either sacred and resembling a short Oratorio or Secular, as a lyric drama set to music but not to be acted, usually for a single voice accompanied by one or more instruments

Vocal Solos
