#### The Comps Online Invoice you receive via email is your entry confirmation

It is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to check your entry before submitting and paying. There will be no corrections to entries, refunds or changing of sections once entries are closed. Make sure all details are correct, including your name, age, sections entered, etc.

The Mackay Eisteddfod Association does <u>NOT</u> review your entry - the onus is on the competitor to ensure that their entry is correct.

We welcome donations for Trophies and Prize Money. Without these generous donations, our event would not go ahead. Payment can be made with your Comps Online entry or by bank deposit, EFTPOS or cash at the Mackay Eisteddfod Office.

### **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

It is the responsibility of all entrants to check individual art forms for specific rules and regulations that apply in addition to these general conditions.

- 1 This competition is open to amateurs only. The term 'amateur' is defined as one whose principal source of income is not derived from performing that talent required for any section entered. This condition does not apply to conductors or accompanists.
- 2 In all sections listed where an age limit applies, the age of the competitor as at 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 shall be considered the age of the competitor (except Highland Dancing where the age is taken as at the date of the competition).
- **3** All entries for Duets/Duos/Trios/Quartets should contain the names and birth dates of all competitors or the entries will not be accepted. (Except Vocal Sections 66 & 68). For Duets/Duos and Trios all competitors must be the age specified.
- 4 No solo competitor will be allowed to compete under any name other than that entered online. It is the Entrants' responsibility to check their Comps Online invoice for accuracy as no changes will be accepted after entries close 7<sup>th</sup> May. In the case of a Duet/Duo/Trio/Quartet, if there is a good reason, then at the discretion of the committee, a new partner may be substituted. Applications for substitutions must be received by 10<sup>th</sup> July (before the program is published). Applications received after this date may be granted, but the competitors will not be eligible for a mark or placing.
- 5 In solo sections, to be eligible to compete in a higher or open age group section the competitor must compete in the same section in his/her own age group (if applicable). Where an age group is specified, only competitors of that age will be eligible to compete.
- **6** Competitors may only have one entry per section. This also applies to competitors entering groups, duets, duos and trios, quartets unless otherwise specified in the schedule.
- 7 Entries must be submitted via the Comps Online web portal <u>www.compsonline.com.au</u> Please ensure that your correct details are entered (name, age, sections entered, email address/postal address, contact phone number, section to sponsor etc.) including Section sponsorships/Trophy donations if applicable, as the Comps Online invoice you receive after payment is your Confirmation of Entry and no corrections will be allowed after entries close.

- 8 Entrants must appear in their section in program order, or forfeit their right to perform, except when clashes between art forms occur and prior arrangement has been made with a committee member at the Eisteddfod Office. Competitors will not be allowed to change to another sub-section where sections have been split into A and B, etc.
- **9** Competitors who do not intend to compete in a section for which they have entered should notify the Eisteddfod Office before the time appointed for that section.
- **10** No teacher or parent will be allowed on stage during a performance unless they are an accompanist or conductor.
- **11** An Adjudication critique will be provided (except in Highland and Irish Dancing sections). Depending on art form, these will be available as an audio critique (via Music Uploads) OR as a hard copy (from the Eisteddfod Office).
- **12** No prompting will be permitted in any sections, if prompted, competitors will face disqualification. No unauthorized person is allowed to stand in the wings during a performance.
- **13** Communication with Adjudicators is strictly prohibited. If it is established that any competitor or unauthorised person has been in contact with an Adjudicator during the course of the Eisteddfod, the Committee reserves the right to disqualify that competitor.
- **14** Competitors must not have had any tuition from any of the Adjudicators for a period of six months prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod.
- **15** Competitors may face disqualification if they do not adhere to time limits set out for various sections. In sections where a time limit is specified, the ringing of a bell will indicate that the time limit has been exceeded, and the competitor must cease to perform.
- **16** The same item (or part thereof) must not be performed more than once by the same competitor throughout the duration of the Eisteddfod (excluding Highland and Irish Dancing).
- 17 The results of each respective aggregate trophy winner shall be determined by a points system. For each section, First place will receive 10 points; Second 7 points; Third 5 points; Fourth 3 points; Fifth 2 points; Sixth 1 point. Exceptions:
  - 1) In Primary and Secondary Choral Choir Championships the Adjudicator's actual marks will be totalled.
  - 2) In Highland Dancing sections, the R.S.O.B.H.D. scrutineering system will be used.
- **18** Competitors compete at their own risk.
- **19** The Committee reserves the right to refuse an Eisteddfod entry and to alter the order of a program without prior notice.
- **20** The Committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or sub-divide sections based on the number of entries received.
- 21 No protest concerning the eligibility of a competitor to compete will be permitted unless made in writing to the Eisteddfod Office on paper or via email (<u>office@mackayeisteddfod.org</u>) prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod, accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. No other protest or disputed matter will be permitted unless made in writing to the Eisteddfod Office on paper or via email (<u>office@mackayeisteddfod.org</u>) within half an hour of the case arising, accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. In all cases the fee will be forfeited if the protest or dispute is deemed frivolous.

- 22 First, Second, Third and Highly Commended placings will be awarded in all sections (excluding Choral and Vocal Primary Group Sections where Gold, Silver and Bronze awards are given). The Adjudicator has the right to withhold any prize where he/she considers there is not sufficient merit.
- **23** The Eisteddfod Committee will not be liable for any copyright infringement relating to the submission of digital and paper copies. Entrants submit copies and works at their own risk. All photocopies submitted for the Adjudicator's use will be destroyed after the completion of the section. One Music forms must be submitted with music copies.
- 24 The use of mobile recording devices, videos and cameras by the audience is prohibited as the capturing of images of performers under 18 may constitute an offence. The Eisteddfod Committee reserves the right to Photograph, record, film, broadcast, videotape or post on our website or Facebook page any item or section of the Eisteddfod. Competitors and/or winner's names and/or photographs may be published by the official photographer or the Eisteddfod committee. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office **MUST BE** notified in writing prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod.
- 25 Every competitor has the right to feel safe at our event. It is strictly prohibited to repost or distribute any official or unofficial recording, photograph or message to a social platform or multiple recipients with the intent to menace/harass/intimidate/ridicule/humiliate a competitor. This will result in immediate disqualification from the current competition with consideration by the executive of exclusion from future events. All such matters, in consultation with the targeted person (victim), may be reported to police.
- **26** Only competitors and designated teachers or studio/school representatives will be permitted backstage.
- 27 No competitor will be allowed to have a mobile phone or other mobile device side stage. This applies to competitors across all art forms.
- **28** No competitor may use the stage at any time without permission from the Stage Manager.
- **29** The committee is unable to make special arrangements for any competitor (including out of town competitors) to appear other than as programmed. Except where clashes between Art forms occur refer point 8 above.
- **30** A high standard of decorum is expected from all participants and spectators. Unseemly behavior will result in offenders being asked to leave and offending competitors being disqualified. In the event of property being damaged in any way, the offenders will be charged accordingly.
- 31 The decision of the Committee shall be final and binding in all matters relating to the interpretation of the Rules and Conditions of the Eisteddfod.



# **OWN CHOICE MUSIC SUBMISSION**

This year **all** competitors will upload repertoire choices online using the website Music Uploads, and all competitors will have access to voice critiques



Region (artform) add-ons are not included in storage plan pricing. The cost to add a Region to your account is extra and this can be done at any time. You must have an active storage plan to save your music. There are 3 plans available.



Further information will be emailed to competitors of each artform leading up to the eisteddfod, outlining all necessary details.

## **CHORAL SINGING - RULES AND CONDITIONS**

# PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Primary and Secondary Choral Choirs must be students of the same school entered for that section.
- 2. Where numbers of voices are stated, the number must be strictly adhered to, otherwise the choir will be disqualified. No interchange of choir members will be allowed during section competition.
- 3. Competitors in choral sections involving "Own Choice" of music shall not perform a piece or item which they have performed during the previous Eisteddfod.
- 4. The pitch of the piano will be A440.
- 5. Where a piece of music specifies a solo part, that part shall be sung collectively by the whole of the voices in that line or alternatively, by a group of voices.
- 6. No instrument other than piano accompaniment shall be allowed, unless otherwise specified.
- 7. No member of one choir, group or ensemble will be permitted to sing with another choir, group or ensemble in the same section.
- 8. Accompanists can play for more than one choir in the same section.
- 9. Choral Singing (Sections 1 to 8, 11, 12 and 16) performances are not to be in costume and actions/gestures only allowed if indicated in the score.
- 10. Folk Groups (Sections 10, 14 and 21) may be in costume and may include movement. Novelty Choirs (Sections 10 and 15) can be in costume and include choreography.
- Competitors will not be allowed to swap where sections have been split into A & B, etc. The Eisteddfod Committee has the authority to combine A & B Choir sections when withdrawals occur causing insufficient numbers in the Sections.

# PRIMARY SCHOOLS

In Sections 1 to 8, if the number of entries necessitates a split into A and B Sections prior to programming, this will be based on the number of students in the choir, as indicated on the entry.

Each choir in Sections 1 to 10 will receive either a Gold, Silver or Bronze Certificate Perpetual Trophy to be awarded as the Adjudicator's choice

- Choral Singing for Schools Year 1 and Under (10 to 60 voices) Time limit for total performance 6 minutes
   (a) Our Chains
  - (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
    - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only
- 2. Choral Singing for Schools Year 2 and Under (10 to 60 voices) Time limit for total performance 6 minutes
  - (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
    - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only
- **3.** Choral Singing for Schools Year 3 and Under (10 to 60 voices) Time limit for total performance 6 minutes
  - (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
    - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only
- 4. Choral Singing for Schools Year 4 and Under (10 to 60 voices) Time limit for total performance 6 minutes
  - (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
    - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only
- 5. Choral Singing for Schools Year 6 and Under (10 to 60 voices) Time limit for total performance 6 minutes
  - (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
    - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only
- 6. Choral Singing for Primary Schools Hymn and Folk (10 to 60 voices)

Time Limit for total performance 6 minutes

(a) Hymn or Sacred Song – (Traditional, Modern, Gospel or Inspirational) - Own Choice(b) Folk Song - Own Choice

- Any two non-electric instruments may be used as accompaniment providing these instruments are played by students attending the same school as the Choir, but these must be included in the maximum of 60 voices.
- Piano accompaniment may be played by either an adult or a student.

## 7. Choral Singing for Primary Schools with an enrolment of 150 or less

(Maximum 40 voices) Time Limit for total performance 6 minutes

(a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)

- Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
- Piano accompaniment only

8. Choral Singing for Primary Schools with an enrolment of 151 to 300

(Maximum 40 voices) Time Limit for total performance 6 minutes

- (a) Own Choice (b) Own Choice (by Australian Composer)
  - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
    - Piano accompaniment only

#### 9. Folk Singing Group for Primary Schools Own Choice (min 3, Max 16)

- Any non-electric instrument/s may be used for accompaniment, but these must be included in the maximum of 16
- No Conductor
- No adult can appear on stage as an accompanist, otherwise the group will face disqualification

# Any four sections above (Sections 1 to 9) are eligible for the Aggregate Award (General Conditions Rule 17)

# **10**. **Novelty / Show Choir for Primary Schools** Own Choice (10 to 60 voices) Time Limit for total performance 7 minutes

- Must be an entertaining Choral presentation that may be costumed and/or choregraphed
- Choir risers optional
- Minimal dialogue
- Props shall be limited to items which can be carried by the members of the group
- Any three instruments may be used as accompaniment providing these are played by students of the same school as the Choir and included in the maximum of 60 performers.
- Piano accompaniment may be played by either an adult or a student

# SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Each Choir in Sections 11 to 15 will receive a Perpetual Shield for First Prize

# 11. Choral Singing for Secondary Schools - Open (minimum of 10 voices)(a) Own Choice (in 2 or more parts)

- (b) Own Choice by an Australian composer (in 2 or more parts)
  - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
  - Piano accompaniment only

#### **12.** Choral Singing for Secondary Schools - Hymn and Folk (10 to 60 voices)

(a) Hymn or Sacred Song - (Traditional, Modern or Gospel, or Inspirational) Own Choice (b) Folk Song – Own Choice.

- Any two non-electric instruments may be used as accompaniment providing these are played by students attending the same school as the choir, but these must be included in the maximum of 60 voices.
- Piano accompaniment may be played by either an adult or a student

#### **13.** Folk Singing Group for Secondary Schools Own Choice (min 3 max 16)

- Any non-electric instrument/s may be used for accompaniment, but these must be included in the maximum of 16
- No conductor
- No adult can appear on stage as an accompanist otherwise the group will face disqualification

#### 14. Jazz / Modern Vocal Group for Secondary Schools Own Choice

Any number of voices (One song)

- Piano accompaniment only
- Conductor optional
- Risers Optional

All four sections above (Sections 11 to 14) are eligible for the Aggregate Award (General Conditions – Rule 17)

**15.** Novelty / Show Choir for Secondary Schools Own Choice (minimum of 10 voices) Time Limit for total performance 7 minutes

- Must be an entertaining Choral presentation that may be costumed and/or choregraphed
- Choir risers optional
- Minimal dialogue
- Props shall be limited to items which can be carried by the members of the group
- Any three instruments may be used as accompaniment providing these are played by students of the same school as the Choir
- Piano accompaniment may be played by either an adult or a student

## **JUVENILE GROUPS** (SCHOOL GROUPS NOT ELIGIBLE)

Each Choir in Sections 16, 17, 20 TO 22 will receive a Perpetual Shield for First Prize

#### 16. Juvenile Chorus - 18 Years and Under

- (a) Own Choice in two or more parts (b) Own Choice
  - Must be Choral Arrangements and be contrasting in nature
  - Piano accompaniment only

## **CABARET**

- 17. Cabaret / Review Style Item Open Own Choice (1 to 6 Voices) Time Limit for total performance 8 mins
  - Must be an entertaining presentation that may be costumed and/or choreographed.
  - Musical theatre pieces allowed
  - Dialogue permitted, but singing must predominate

#### **OPEN CHORAL**

20. Open Chorus – Time Limit 7 mins

Own Choice in 2 or more parts must be a Choral Arrangement

- Piano accompaniment only
- **21.** Folk Singing Group Open Own Choice (min 3 max 16).
  - Any non-electric instrument/s may be used for accompaniment, but these must be included in the maximum of 16
  - No conductor
- 22. Jazz / Modern Group Open Unison or parts Own Choice
  - Accompaniment optional
  - Simple choreography allowed

#### **CHORAL AWARDS**

#### THE CARMEL DAVESON AWARD:

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the most accomplished Primary Choral Conductor. This is a Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

#### THE FRIENDS OF THE CONSERVATORIUM PRIMARY CHORAL ACCOMPANIST AWARD:

To be awarded by the Adjudicator, to the accompanist most proficient in the Primary Choral Sections.

This is a Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento Prize money \$50

#### KODALY MACKAY SECONDARY CHORAL CONDUCTOR AWARD

To be awarded by the Adjudicator, to the most accomplished Secondary Choral Conductor. This is a Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

#### **MACROSSAN & AMIET SOLICITORS CHORAL CHAMPIONSHIP (PRIMARY SCHOOLS)**

To be awarded to the Primary School securing the most Adjudicator's points in any four of the following nine sections:

Section 1 (Year 1 and Under), Section 2 (Year 2 and Under), Section 3 (Year 3 and Under), Section 4 (Year 4 and Under), Section 5 (Year 6 and Under), Section 6 (Hymn & Folk), Section 7 (Enrolment up to 150), Section 8 (Enrolment 151-300), Section 9 (Folk Singing) First prize \$300.00 - Runner up prize \$150.00

#### MACROSSAN & AMIET SOLICITORS CHORAL CHAMPIONSHIP (SECONDARY SCHOOLS)

To be awarded to the Secondary School securing the most Adjudicator's points in all of the following sections:

Section 11 - (Open), Section 12 (Hymn and Folk), Section 13 (Folk Singing) and Section 14 (Jazz/Modern)

First prize \$300.00 - Runner up prize \$150.00

## VOCAL SOLOS, DUETS AND TRIOS RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1) Competitors in vocal sections shall not perform a piece or item which they have performed during the previous two Eisteddfods.
- 2) In Sections 23 to 24 (where own choice is NOT stated), age-appropriate selections of music are to be sourced from the following books:
  - SINGERS WORLD BOOK 1
  - 10 SONGS FOR YOUNG SINGERS by Robert Keane
  - NURSERY & FOLK SONGS by Denise Bacon

- 3) In Sections 25 to 28 (where own choice is NOT stated), age appropriate selections of music are to be sourced from the following books:
  - SINGERS WORLD BOOK 1 & 2
  - 10 SONGS FOR YOUNG SINGERS by Robert Keane
  - NURSERY & FOLK SONGS by Denise Bacon
  - ANIMAL CRACKERS by Colin Brumby
  - 25 FOLKSONG SOLOS FOR CHILDREN
- 4) The pitch of the piano will be A440.
- 5) No costumes or choreographed movement to be used in any Vocal solos (Sections 23 to 48 inclusive)
- 6) To be eligible to compete in a higher or open age group section the competitor must compete in the same item in his/her own age group section (if applicable). (Aggregate points will be awarded from the competitor's correct age group only). Where an age group is specified, only competitors of that age will be eligible to compete (e. g. 17 to 25 Years then you must be aged from 17 to 25 Years).
- 7) Vocal items may be performed in any key (unless otherwise specified) and transposed, if necessary.
- 8) No instrument other than piano/guitar accompaniment shall be allowed, unless otherwise specified.
- 9) All solos from Musicals (Sections 49 to 57) shall be a fully developed performance in costume with characterization, movement, stage sense and an overall ability to meet the vocal and other demands of the item concerned. Props shall be limited to items which can be carried on and off stage by the performer. The song choice must be sung by a character from the Musical, not a theme song.
- 10) Sections 64 to 68 will be judged on Vocal content. Harmony must predominate. No costumes or choreographed movement.
- 11) <u>No official accompanists are provided</u>, and singers must arrange their own accompanist.
- 12) Competitors will not be allowed to swap where sections have been split into A and B.
- 13) Own Choice music is required to be age appropriate.

#### VOCAL AWARDS

To be awarded to the competitor securing most points in any five of the following open sections - Operatic Aria, Song by an Australian Composer, Song from a Musical, Vocal Solo, Sacred Solo (section 39 only), Modern Solo, Oratorio.

This is a Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento Prize money \$50.00

#### **17 TO 25 YEARS AGGREGATE AWARD**

To be awarded to the competitor (17 to 25 Years) securing the most points in **all** the following five sections: Classical Solo, Sacred Solo (section 38 only), Modern Solo, Song from any Musical and Song by an Australian Composer. - Prize money \$50.00

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento THE FRIENDS OF THE CONSERVATORIUM TROPHY

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor in the Open Sections most deserving of encouragement. - Prize money \$50.00

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

#### MISS NOELA SHEPHERD MEMORIAL TROPHY

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor (12 Years and Under) most deserving of encouragement

#### **SCOPE CLUB TROPHY**

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor (13 Years and Over) most deserving of encouragement.

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

#### FATHER STEPHEN HANLY AWARD

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor (17 to 25 Years) most deserving of encouragement. Prize money \$300.00

#### **RISING STAR ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD**

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the young male competitor (13 Years and Under) most deserving of encouragement.

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento THE BARBER SHOP SINGER'S ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the young male competitor (14 to 17 Years) most deserving of encouragement. - Prize money of \$75.00

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

**THE ERIC VENABLES MEMORIAL AWARD:** to be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor (25 Years and Over) who he/she deems as having the most pleasing modern/musical voice. Prize money \$250.00

#### THE MAUREEN KOCHEVATKIN MEMORIAL AWARD

To be awarded by the Adjudicator to the competitor (17 to 25 Years) for the most outstanding Classical Performance. - Prize money \$50.00

Perpetual trophy to be competed for annually and a Replica will be presented as a memento

#### **BURSARIES**

#### THE JOE NORRIS BURSARY:

To be awarded to the local competitor (10 Years and Under) who in the opinion of the Adjudicator shows most promise as a performer. The winner will receive **\$200.00** 

#### THE BUTCH BERNET BURSARY:

To be awarded to the local competitor (11 to 14 Years) who in the opinion of the Adjudicator shows most promise as a performer. The winner will receive **\$200.00** 

#### THE MACROSSAN AND AMIET BURSARY:

To be awarded to the local competitor (15 to 18 Years) who in the opinion of the Adjudicator shows most promise as a performer. The winner will receive **\$200.00**

#### **HIGHLAND DANCING RULES AND CONDITIONS**

#### PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. This competition is registered with FNQ 12/25 and will be conducted under the rules and conditions as set down by RSOBHD and as adopted by ABHDI.
- 2. Dancers must be registered and present their registration card on day of competition.
- 3. Dancers are to compete in their own age group and one classification only.
- 4. Age will be taken as at date of competition. Where age is in dispute, registration card must be produced.
- 5. Age groupings for sections will be decided on receipt of entries.
- 6. Competitors must use the official music and swords provided by the committee.
- 7. Mackay Eisteddfod Association Inc is to be notified IMMEDIATELY of a change of classification; and/or if a dancer is unable to compete after submitting an entry.
- 8. Entries must be accompanied by entry fees and no entries will be accepted after the closing date.
- 9. Dancers arriving late for a section will not be allowed to compete if the dance has Been completed. Alternatively, competitors may not pre-dance prior to the commencement of a section.
- 10. No warm-up or practicing is permitted backstage whilst dancers are competing.
- 11. Dancers to observe the ABHDI direction 'competitors should be modestly attired at all times'.
- 12. **PRE-PREMIER** Eligibility for Pre-Premier section will apply as at date of competition and shall be in accordance with SOBHD registration scheme.
- 13. Dancers must 'fill in' if requested by the Organiser. If a competitor fails to fill in unless for a medical reason the Organiser has the right to enforce Rule 1g, Page 42 D-Judges, SOBHD Rules and Regulations, which reads: Provided due prominence is given to the fact in the program or in a brochure by the Organiser, then during the course of a competition the comportment of the competitors may come under the jurisdiction of the judges, not only whilst dancing, but also when entering or leaving the platform and whilst waiting for the dance to start. Any unseemly behaviour on the part of a competitor or any misdemeanor likely to upset the decorum of the proceedings may be penalised by the judges and could lead to disqualification, but a full report of any such misconduct on the part of a competitor must be submitted by the judges to the Organiser.
- 14. The use of electronic devices of any kind to record competing dancers will NOT be permitted.
- 15. Any complaint made by an individual against the organisation, or the adjudication of an event must be in writing stating the complainant's full name and address and be lodged with the organiser, if possible, on the day of the event, and no later than 48 hours after the event. Such a complaint is to be accompanied by a fee of \$5.00, which is refundable if the protest is upheld.
- 16. Subject to the official protest ruling, the Judge's decision is final.
- 17. Scrutineering system for Championship, Titles and Aggregates awards will be as per the SOBHD Constitution.

- 18. For presentation of prizes on stage, dancers must be in kilt or national costume. Competitor's number must be worn.
- 19. The committee reserves the right to appoint substitute adjudicators and/or alter the program at any time.
- 20. Teachers, interested parties or any other unauthorised person must not communicate with judges during a competition. All enquiries must be made to the Highland Dance subcommittee at the official table.
- 21. Dancers compete entirely at their own risk.
- 22. Any rules pertaining to competitions released from SOBHD or ABHDI from time of printing this schedule and actual date of competition will be adhered to.
- 23. **TITLES** Dancers may choose not to compete in all dances that make up the title and still be eligible for an overall title prize, however, the full title fee still applies.
- 24. Dancers under 18 and all other children are the responsibility of parents or guardians at all times and should be appropriately supervised throughout the competition by them or another nominated adult.
- 25. A minimum of three competitors is required to dance in Titles, or the section will be declared cancelled. Only Premier Level Dancers are eligible for the Titles.
- 26. The audience is requested to remain seated while competitors are dancing on stage.
- 27. Dancers who stop during the course of their performance must stand and not exit the platforms so that they do not distract the other dancers still performing and also the judges.
- 28. Competition Dress Rule In order to meet the requirements of the Child Protection legislation; ALL competitors are to use the allocated dressing rooms provided to change in; ALL competitors must be modestly attired at all times; a t-shirt, or similar must be worn if vest or jacket is removed.
- 29. Photography rule Following the awards parents may photograph their own child or others with parental permission but be highly aware that there must not be other children in shot whose privacy must be protected.
- 30. As organisers of this event, we plan to photograph competitors for the purpose of posting on our Website, Facebook & Instagram pages or in the newspaper. Please indicate if you wish to opt out of this process by emailing the Eisteddfod Office: <u>office@mackayeisteddfod.org</u> at least one week prior to the competition date.

#### **IRISH DANCING RULES AND CONDITIONS**

#### PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. This competition is registered with A.I.D.A. Inc. and only entries from pupils of registered AIDA Inc. teachers will be accepted. A.I.D.A Inc. Competition Registration Number: 5744/25
- 2. All competitors must be registered with AIDA Inc. at the time of entering & AIDA Inc. registration number MUST be submitted when entering with Comps Online. Any entry received without an AIDA Inc. registration number will not be accepted.
- 3. Competitors in all solo dances and all levels will be dancing two or three at a time. If dancers bump hard during a dance, they may re dance.
- Music: Competitors in all sections will be dancing to official music supplied by the Committee except in the case of Reels in Couples/Three Hand, Four Hand Jig and Choreography Teams. The same tune will be played for each section in its entirety. All music is at set speeds.
- 5. Irish dancing age of competitor will be taken as at 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025.
- 6. The Adjudicator's decision is final. Protests, if any, must be submitted in writing and lodged with the Competition Organizer within half an hour of the case arising accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. If the protest is considered frivolous, the fee will be forfeited.
- 7. No persons other than Committee members may approach the Adjudicator before, during or at the conclusion of the competition.
- 8. Only MECC staff, Eisteddfod Members, Competitors who have been called, Registered AIDA Inc Teachers and official volunteers designated by the Eisteddfod Association are permitted backstage. All other persons will be asked to leave.
- 9. With regard to age of team members only 25% of the "13 Years and Over" team can consist of "Under 13 Years" dancers. With regard to dancers competing in more than one team, within an age group, permission must be obtained from the Competition Organizer to do so. All competing teams must only dance Steps and Figures from the Ceili dances as set out in "Ar Rinci Ceili". Each team can only dance once.
- 10. The Adjudicator will award encouragement trophies in Beginners, Primary, Intermediate and Open levels.
- 11. No make-up, false tan, wigs and solo dresses are to be worn by competitors Under 12 Years of age in Beginners or Primary Level as per IDC rules.
- 12. Make-Up (including false eyelashes) and false tan is not permitted for dancers, in either solo or team competitions, up to and including the Under 10 Years age group. (Effective March 1, 2014).
- 13. If a dancer loses a heel or a complete shoe, he/she must stand back allowing the other dancer to continue dancing uninhibited. Such a dancer will then be allowed to re-dance.

- 14. Should a dancer bump, slip or fall, they may re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 15. No block, en point, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the 11 Years and Underage groups.
- 16. If a dancer falls the adjudicator *must* ring the bell. The dancer will be permitted to re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 17. Lead Round / heavy dancing. In all competitions for Primary, Intermediate and Open, in all heavy dancing ie Jig and Hornpipe, the Lead Round must be danced on both right and left foot.
- 18. In graded sections, competitors are required to perform correct standard of work as set out in the AIDA Inc. Competitions Rules and Regulations. Competitors will be disqualified by adjudicators if incorrect standard of work is performed.
- 19. Solo costumes (including headwear) worn in championship competitions must not include any Identifying Designs. Dancers breaching this rule must be instructed to either amend or replace the costume in order to appear on stage to compete. Dancers who are unable to amend or replace the costume may still participate but will not be scored. 'Identifying Designs' are defined as any element on any costume worn in championship solo competitions identifying a status of achievement or an Irish dance competition award (i.e. globes). Solo costumes (including headwear) worn in championship competitions must not include any names or initials. Dancers breaching this rule must be instructed to either amend or replace the costume in order to appear on stage to compete. Dancers who are unable to amend or replace the costume may still participate, but will not be scored.
- 20. Competitors in Bun Grad & Tus Grad, up to and including the Under 12 age group, may only wear traditional class costumes or long/short-sleeved blouses/shirts and skirts/trousers, polo tops & skirts/ trousers, body suits & skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted.
- 21. Costume Length: Length of costumes must adhere to principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier not less than 70 per cent) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition. For competitions adjudicated by a panel of more than one adjudicator, all adjudicators on the panel must agree to asking the dancer to wear tights.
- 22. Lodgement of an entry shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Parent and Pupils concerned accept the above Rules, the General Conditions and also all rules as set down by An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha and agree to strictly abide by same.

#### PLEASE ALSO REFER TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Competitors requiring an accompanist are requested to make their own arrangements.
- Instrumental Duets, Trios and Quartets (Sections 500 to 505) and Instrumental Solos (Sections 551 - 567) - Copies of music/scores MUST be submitted to the Eisteddfod Office on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2025 between 9am and 4pm. More information about this can be found on the next page.
- 3. Instrumental Trio/Quartet (Sections 503, 504 and 505) In *special* circumstances, one player only may be substituted for another, subject to approval by the Art Form Head. Notice by email must be sent at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of the Instrumental Sections to allow time for changes to be approved.
- 4. For Instrumental Groups (Sections 506 to 521), scores for the adjudicator can be submitted to the Eisteddfod Office on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2025 between 9am and 4pm. Alternatively, they can be submitted to the Eisteddfod office at the MECC on the day of the performance. Please ensure the scores are received at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the session. Scores must be in performance order in a clearly marked folder with School name and section entered.
- 5. Standardised stage layouts have been adopted for Group Sections 508, 509, 514, 515, 517, 519, and 521. The layouts must be used by all groups competing in these sections unless prior arrangement has been made with the Eisteddfod Office and Art Form Head. Please refer to the diagrams available on the Mackay Eisteddfod web page.
- For all Instrumental Groups the Competitor Stage Layout MUST be submitted by email along with the titles of the pieces being performed to the Instrumental Art Form Head, Helen Williams <u>hjwil0@eq.edu.au</u> by 8<sup>th</sup> August 2025.
- 7. To reduce lengthy delays between competitors the order of performances in Instrumental Group sections (506 to 521) will not be balloted but will be determined by the Art Form Head or Stage Manager.
- 8. Repertoire chosen for Sections 500, 501 and 502 MUST be appropriate for a Duet. i.e. Written for 2 instruments, NOT solo and accompaniment. One player per part.
- 9. Repertoire chosen for Sections 503, 504 and 505 MUST be appropriate with one player per part. In these sections specifically, in special circumstances, one player only may be substituted. See Rules and Conditions.
- 10. For Section 506 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.
- 11. For School Ensemble Sections 506 through to 518 inclusive, ensembles must contain students who are all from the same school.
- 12. For Section 513 and 518 specifically, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors must be playing a different instrument in each group.
- 13. For Sections 514 and 515 Ensembles may compete in either section 514 or 515. They are not permitted to enter both Sections. Instrumentalists will be permitted to play in more than one group, however, they must play a different instrument in each group.
- 14. Repertoire chosen for Group Sections 519 and 521 should be suitable for, and reflect the standard usually required for Open Sections. This would ultimately be at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

- 15. For Sections 519 and 521 Ensembles may compete in either section 519 or 521. They are not permitted to enter both Sections.
- 16. For Sections 519, 520 and 521, competitors will be permitted to play in more than one group. However, competitors can play in no more than three groups within these sections. Ensembles must either contain students who are all from the same school or be a recognized, regularly rehearsing community ensemble.
- 17. All entries must clearly state the type of instrumentation on their entry form, i.e. (Djembe group, Clarinet Ensemble, Mixed Instrumental Group etc.). Competitors in sections 508 -512, 514 -517 are exempt from this.
