RUIFS

General:

- 1. All competitors, teachers and guardians competing and/or attending the Lockyer District Dancing Festival do so at their own risk.
- 2. Decisions of the Committee are final and binding on all matters:
 - o The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entries
 - To ask proof of age of any competitor
 - To amend programming as necessary
 - o To divide an item if there are excess entries
 - To cancel an item if there are insufficient entries
 - o To combine age groups if there are insufficient entries
 - o The Executive Committee is the sole arbitrator in any disputes, or misinterpretation of these rules.
- 3. Any persons present at the Lockyer District Dancing Festival displaying bad sportsmanship of ANY manner, will be disqualified and asked to leave the premises immediately. All remaining entries may be forfeited at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
- 4. Any protests must be submitted in writing to the Convenor within 30 minutes of the reason for the protest occurring. Any protest must be accompanied by a \$10 fee payable to the LDDF.
- 5. The Committee reserves the right to substitute an Adjudicator should this become necessary.
- 6. In the interest of fairness, performers who have had professional contact with the Adjudicator during a period of 12 months prior to the Eisteddfod are not eligible to compete. Entry fees will be refunded should this be the case. Competitors found in breach of this rule may be disqualified.
- 7. No communication whatsoever is permitted with the Adjudicator prior to the completion of the Festival. This rule applies equally to competitors, teachers, guardians, or other interested parties. The Committee may consider disqualification of any competitor/associated persons in breach of this rule. All enquiries can be directed to the Convenor.
- 8. The Adjudicator has the discretion, following concurrence with the Committee, to divide and/or withhold a prize.
- 9. All decisions regarding awards and bursaries are final.
- 10. Competitors who stop during a performance and leave the stage may re-appear for comments only. No mark or place will be awarded. The exception being 6 years & under sections who can re-appear and be marked or placed at the Adjudicator's discretion.
- 11. A performer not completing their performance due to genuine TECHNICAL difficulties will be allowed to return to the stage and receive a score at the Adjudicator's discretion.
- 12. Prompting of an onstage competitor is strictly prohibited, except for 6 years and under items.
- 13. Only AMATEUR competitors are eligible for competition at our Eisteddfod. The definition of "amateur" is hereby defined as persons who ARE NOT deriving a primary income from the Dance Industry or who are under contract of any capacity in a Professional Dance Company.
- 14. All competitors are required to register on the programme placed sidestage and report to the sidestage conductor of all sessions.

- 15. Competitors must appear in the order in which they appear in the programme, unless deemed impractical by appropriate LDDF representatives sidestage and at the back table. All changes to the order of appearance are at the discretion of the LDDF Committee.
- 16. By participating in this Eisteddfod, all persons accept that they will be photographed or filmed and that these images may be used for promotion of the Eisteddfod. Please be aware that the official photographer as well as LDDF may use the images to promote their event. If privacy is required for a competitor, please contact the convenor prior to the Festival.
- 17. Photography and/or videotaping is strictly prohibited in dressing rooms.
- 18. The Committee shall not be responsible for any infringement of Copyright or Music Licensing.
- 19. Only actively volunteering LDDF Officials are allowed sidestage during performances. In addition to these volunteers there may be ONE person per competitor/item allowed to chaperone a performer/item. Only a chaperone/LDDF volunteer or the performer themself can be responsible for placing and removal of any props. Larger/heavier items may be moved by other approved persons prior to the item's commencement (at the Committee's discretion). Front stage steps are only to be used at the Eisteddfod's instruction. LDDF's backstage personnel have the right to remove any persons who breach this rule.
- 20. All dressing rooms are unisex for all participants to use. Anyone requiring special consideration, or the use of a restricted dressing room must notify the Convenor prior to the Festival. Requests may not be accommodated.
- 21. Stage measurements are approximately 8m x 15m excluding the wings and apron.
- 22. No voice accompaniment allowed during song and dance and musical theatre items during any 'singing section' of the routine. All aforementioned items will be closely monitored for this reason. Any breach of this rule will see disqualification.
- 23. No National Character content allowed in any tapping sections.
- 24. Routines are not to be repeated in multiple sections except for designated Championship sections as specified in these rules.
- 25. Tights/Stockings are required for ALL female competitors regardless of genre or age.
- 26. All competitors must have "TAPS" attached to their shoes in all items where tapping is performed.

 Backstage personnel have the authority to inspect all shoes.
- 27. Naked flames, fueled lamps, liquids, powders or ANY potentially hazardous materials will not be allowed on stage under any circumstances.
- 28. Trampolines or springboards are strictly not allowed in any acrobatic sections.
- 29. Upon entering the Lockyer District Dancing Festival, competitors agree to abide by any relevant COVID Safe plan/rules and will follow directions given by the Committee in relation to any COVID issues. Failure to do so will see the competitor/persons being asked to leave the venue immediately.

Entries:

- 30. Age determination date: 1st January 2025.
- 31. Entries will only be accepted via the Comps Online Portal. By entering the Festival, you agree to be bound by the rules outlined in this schedule.
- 32. Entry fees are NOT REFUNDABLE unless outlined in these rules (Rule #6). Submitting an entry for the Lockyer District Dancing Festival confirms your acceptance that any item can be scheduled at any time, during the advertised start and finish dates. Due to the large number of entries, requests for specific days cannot be taken into consideration.
- 33. The voice critiques will be uploaded to Musicuploads.
- 34. Music will only be accepted via the MusicUploads portal. Failure to have music submitted by the required date may see your entry forfeited. It is your responsibility to check music once uploaded.

Solos:

- 35. A competitor may appear only once in any Solo, Duo, or Trio age sections.
- 36. Solo/Duo/Trio competitors may only enter in their designated age group in any section. No Solo/Duo/Trio competitor will be allowed to dance up an age group unless there is no section available that pertains to the competitor's age. In this event, all "up-age" entries must be approved by the Convenor upon entry.
- 37. The Novice Solo sections are only open to competitors who have not placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in the genre being entered at any previous Dance Eisteddfod prior to the closing date for entries. Competitors may NOT repeat the same dance in any other section, nor may they enter Championships.
- 38. ONE small single prop is permitted in the own choreography or improvisation sections. *
- 39. Basic block colour dance attire with no sparkles, studio logos or adornments must be worn in the own choreography and improvisation sections.
 - *A guide to follow is if the item is <code>used</code> in the dance, it is a prop and if it is <code>worn</code> then it is a costume.

Groups:

- 40. A minimum of four competitors will be accepted for groups.
- 41. A competitor may appear no more than twice in any group section.
- 42. No groups consisting of identical children may appear more than once in any group section. Should this rule be breached the 2nd group will be automatically disqualified. Primary and High School groups do not have to abide by this rule.
- 43. To be eligible for the Fay Hauser Memorial Group Trophy, a studio must have performed in no less than **TEN** group items in total.

Championships:

- 44. No routine is to be performed more than once, unless specified/allowed. Change of costume and/or music does not constitute change of routine.
- 45. Competitors entering 6 years & under sections cannot enter Championships.
- 46. Competitors in Championships must appear in the order in which they appear in the program.

 Extreme circumstances where competitors can dance out of order will be at the Executive

 Committee's discretion.
- 47. If a competitor leaves the stage during a Championship routine, they will not be given a score and will not be placed.
- 48. Competitors must dance and receive a score in the following sections to qualify:
 - o BALLET CHAMPIONSHIP both Classical Solo & Demi-Character Solo
 - o TAP CHAMPIONSHIP Straight Tap PLUS either Waltz OR Speed Tap
 - MODERN CHAMPIONSHIP Jazz Up Tempo PLUS either Lyrical OR Contemporary
 - SONG & DANCE CHAMPIONSHIP Song & Dance Tap or Song & Dance Ex Tap
- 49. Competitors must perform the following dances in the Championship Sections:
 - BALLET CHAMPIONSHIP: Classical Solo & Demi-Character (Demi can be repeated from normal sections)
 - TAP CHAMPIONSHIP: Slow Tap & Speed Tap (Speed Tap can be repeated from normal sections)
 - MODERN CHAMPIONSHIP: Jazz Up Tempo PLUS Lyrical OR Contemporary (Jazz can be repeated from normal sections)
 - SONG & DANCE CHAMPIONSHIP: Song & Dance Tap or Song & Dance Ex Tap (No repeat allowed)

Prizes:

- 50. Prizes can be obtained from the Convenors table after the conclusion of the session.
- 51. The perpetual trophy award winners are responsible for the collection and engraving and must be returned one month prior to the Eisteddfod.

Time Limits:

52. All items will have time limits and be monitored by the Adjudicator. Time limits which include entries and exits are **MAXIMUM TIME LIMITS**. Please be aware that any characterisation before or after routines, performed with/without music, will be classed as timed performance. If this rule is broken points will be deducted at the adjudicator's discretion.

Auditorium Rules:

- 54. All persons entering the auditorium must secure an entry ticket before admittance is allowed. Door volunteers and the Committee have the right to request the sighting of an entry ticket and ask any persons to leave who cannot produce a current session ticket. Teacher passes will be distributed at a rate of 2 teacher passes per studio.
- 55. Private videotaping or still photography of routines is strictly prohibited. There will be professional videotaping and photographers in house during the course of the Festival.
- 56. No tap shoes are to be worn in the hall unless covered. Costumes are to be always covered in the auditorium.
- 57. Children must be kept still and quiet during performances.
- 58. Walking around the auditorium whilst a performance is underway is strictly prohibited. Failure to adhere to this rule can result in removal from the site.
- 59. Please be mindful of noise at the back of the hall during performances. No running / jumping/ rehearsing on wooden Floors.

DEFINITIONS

Novice:

The Novice Section is for Competitors who have not been placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the genre being entered at any dance competition as at the closing date for entries. Competitors may NOT repeat the same dance in any other section, nor may they enter Championships.

Straight Tap:

Any style or tempo of tapping in a 4/4-time signature, including techniques such as tonality, musicality, rhythm and syncopation.

- No pre-recorded Tap sounds in the music are allowed.
- Tap shoes with taps must be worn.

Waltz Tap:

Same as the above Tap description but must be choreographed and performed in a 3/4 or 6/8 time signature.

Speed Tap:

Same as the above Tap description but must be choreographed to a fast tempo and performed at that pace.

Slow Tap:

Same as the above Tap description but must be choreographed to a slower tempo in 4/4 time and performed as such.

Song & Tap: (Also referred to as "Song and Dance Tap")

Tap technique must be used in this division. The singing elements and dance segment of the routine should be evenly balanced and equally strong.

- No voice backing vocals allowed during the song component.
- Voice over/backing vocals are allowed during the dance component.

Song and Dance Ex.Tap:

Any genre of dance technique may be used in this division. The singing elements and dance segment of the routine should be evenly balanced and equally strong.

- No voice backing vocals allowed during the song component.
- Voice over/backing vocals are allowed during the dance component.

Musical Theatre:

A live presentation from a stage or film Musical.

- Must include singing, dialogue and dance components.
- No backing vocals or spoken dialogue allowed in the entire track or accompaniment
- Must be presented in the style of a stage or screen musical.

Cabaret:

A routine with emphasis placed on entertainment value, with characteristics of what one might expect to see at a nightclub or a restaurant.

• Performance and costume must be family friendly.

Broadway Jazz:

Routine should be based on Jazz Technique, stylized using exaggeration, quirkiness, and athleticism so that the movement is story and character driven.

Jazz (Up Tempo):

A routine comprised primarily of Jazz technique, performed to Up Tempo Music.

Hip Hop:

Consists of Street, Funk, and commercial techniques.

Lyrical: (Formerly Neo-Classical/Slow Modern)

Consists of Jazz and Ballet technique, with an emphasis placed on strength, control, and musical interpretation. Should include emotional and storytelling elements. May include Neo Classical and Slow Modern dance styling.

Contemporary:

Consists of Modern and Ballet technique, reaching beyond the standard Jazz Vocabulary. Should be primarily based on recognized methods such as but not limited to:

- Cunningham Technique
- Graham Technique
- Horton Technique
- Limon Technique

Using concepts such as contraction, release, gravity and weight, swing, rebound, fall, recovery and suspension.

Classical:

Routine must be comprised of Ballet technique incorporating formal classical movements and lines.

- No repertoire allowed.
- Acrobatic/gymnastic tricks are not allowed in this category.

Demi-Character:

A genre based on Classical Ballet technique, where the storyline and/or portrayal of a character must be as strong and equal to the dance component.

No repertoire allowed.

National:

Must represent a country and its traditions, using authentic music, steps, and costumes.

Acrobatic:

A routine containing acrobatic movement/tumbling/gymnastics. May contain contortion work.

Novelty:

A routine that includes innovative dance movements that incorporate a theme, concept, or characterisation throughout the entire performance.

Own Choreography:

A dance student must choreograph dances with no assistance from any teacher or choreographer. Please refer to rule #38 for onstage allowances regarding attire and props. Any form of dance except Song and Dance or Song and Tap may be performed in the Choreography Section.

Improvisation:

Music to be chosen by the adjudicator. Competitors will hear the music once before going on stage to perform. Involves creating and executing movement spontaneously, without any premeditated movement.

Championship Groups:

Chosen by the adjudicator and announced on group weekend. No extra dance is required to be performed; however, the winning group may be invited to appear in the gala at the conclusion of the festival.

Primary & High School Groups

All competitors must be a current student at the school they are representing.

All Abilities High School Groups

An inclusive section in any style of dance specifically to encourage and include students with physical and intellectual impairments and disabilities. Dancers of ALL abilities may compete.

Repertoire

To be eligible to compete in the Repertoire section, entrants must have performed a classical ballet solo. All entrants are to participate in a compulsory masterclass and then perform their repertoire solo. Entrants can perform from one of the repertoire pieces provided below. Accurate interpretation, costuming and music will be taken into account. The entry fee for the Repertoire item is \$20 and will only go ahead if there are a minimum of 8 dancers entered. In the event that the minimum requirement is not met, all entrants will receive a refund for their Repertoire entry fee.

Awarded to a local competitor, who attends a local studio in the Lockyer District, who participated in solos as well as groups for an eligible studio. To be eligible a competitor must have performed in four or more solo items and four or more groups for the same studio. The Bursary is awarded to the competitor with the highest points gained over four solo performances, excluding championships, own choreography and improvisation sections. Should there be a tie, the highest five marks will be added.

\$100 & Trophy

Lockyer Valley Regional Council Bursary

Awarded to the **Most Outstanding All-Round** Performer of the Festival. To be eligible a competitor must have performed in **6 or more Solo items** (excluding Championships, Own Choreography and Improvisation sections).

Lockyer District Dancing Festival Scholarship Trophy, \$500 Scholarship & Certificate

This award recipient is chosen by the adjudicator as the **most promising** local competitor **any age***. The award is intended to assist the local competitor to further their dance study through extra classes or summer school/vacation intensive to the value of \$500.

^{*}Recipient must attend a local dance school and compete exclusively for a local dance school, in both the solo and group competition at the festival.

^{*}Can not be won by the same competitor in 2 consecutive years running.
