- 1. <u>Each competitor must provide the adjudicator with a copy of the music.</u> Music must be clearly marked with the section number and the competitor number and handed to the librarian PRIOR to the commencement of the session or an hour before the section begins.
- 2. All photocopied material will be retained by the committee to be destroyed according to Copyright Ruling.
- 3. Competitors may enter one championship relevant to their age category.
- 4. All competitors entering the Championship section must also perform in at least 2 (two) other piano solo sections. One section must include either Baroque, Romantic, Classical, in your age section. (The Concerto section is included as one section.) Duets, family fun, accompaniment and own composition are not included.
- 5. Competitors must compete in at least 3 (three) solo sections to be eligible for all major awards. Solo sections include own composition section and concerto section.
- 6. Highest aggregate awards will include all sections with the exception of duet and fun events.
- 7. To be eligible for a scholarship candidates must compete in a minimum of 4 sections, these sections can include duet, concerto or own composition sections.
- 8. Time limits are to be adhered to. Concession may be given if prior (at least 2 weeks) notice given.
- 9. Novice section is open to any student who has not won a first place at any Eisteddfod.
- 10. No repeats are to be played
- 11. Any section with less than 3 performers can be combined at the discretion of the covener.
- 12. Own Composition award will be judged both on the performance and the composition.
- 13. Open section open to all ages and refers to amateur musicians
- 14. The Eisteddfod reserves the right to:
 - (a) refuse an entry
 - b) cancel a section (e.g. due to lack of entries)
 - (c) vary the prizes (e.g. when insufficient entries perform)
 - (d) demand proof of age of an entrant in an age section, or proof of amateur or professional status.

ADJUDICATOR



Francis Louran BMus BA (Syd)

Francis Louran has been an examiner of piano candidates since 1990. In addition, he has examined brass and voice candidates for the AMEB, and various disciplines and ensembles for the Board of Studies (HSC). He studied Music and English at Sydney University and the NSW State Conservatorium, and graduated with Merit and first prize for piano in his degree course. Following further studies in Paris and England, Francis was appointed to the staff of the Riverina College of Advanced Education as an Artist-in-Residence and as a junior lecturer in Music in its undergraduate Arts programme. After extensive performing in NSW and Victoria as well as teaching and lecturing in the degree programme of the College, Francis was invited to direct a music school in the west of Sydney as a senior officer of the NSW Division of Cultural Activities within the Premier's Department.

Francis joined the staff of Sydney Grammar School as a Music and English master, and for 14 years taught secondary English, class Music and conducted many of the School's bands, orchestras and choirs. He pursued his work experience at Eton College in the UK, and was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to study the music of Bach at Jesus College Oxford during his tenure at Sydney Grammar School.

Francis held the post of Director of Music at Cranbrook School in Bellevue Hill in Sydney for 11 years where he managed the K-12 curriculum, conducted ensembles, accompanied and directed musicals in association with Ascham School. After retiring from full-time classroom education, Francis established a private studio focusing on Music education for HSC candidates, including composition. Francis continues to teach in the classroom from time to time, writes articles on the raising of successful children in the high school environment, adjudicates eisteddfods, accompanies young performers in HSC examinations, and examines for the AMEB.
