To play their part in this, we ask all entrants, teachers, parents/guardians and audience members to uphold and model the values and expectations set out in this Code of Conduct.

Respect Acknowledge, consider and respect the rights and points of view of others, treating

them with courtesy and empathy.

Inclusion Celebrate difference and individuality, including everyone regardless of their age,

abilities, identity, gender, religion or cultural background

Integrity Protect and maintain the integrity of the Eisteddfod, through ethical conduct, abiding

by the terms and conditions of the competition.

Etiquette Honour performance etiquette with appropriate presentation, thorough preparation,

and punctuality.

Engagement Engage in the creative process as an active participant and audience member

supporting, and learning from, your fellow artists.

Appreciation Recognise and encourage the work of other performers, commending creative

risk-taking, bold choices, and curiosity to learn and experiment. Please note that while applause is most welcome, we ask that you refrain from whistling, calling out and

stamping as these can be distracting

Safety Take personal responsibility for safety through behaviour and actions; always listen to

and follow instructions from the Inverell Eisteddfod Committee.

Violence, bullying or inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated. Such misconduct may result in the disqualification of entrants from their respective event(s) and you will be asked to leave the Eisteddfod.

Thank you for making Inverell Eisteddfod a vibrant and inclusive celebration of the performing arts!

By entering the Inverell Eisteddfod you agree to abide by the rules and regulations as outlined in this Syllabus. Inverell Eisteddfod's public liability does not comprehensively cover injury to performers, therefore individuals and schools must ensure that they are adequately covered whilst performing or otherwise enter at their own risk. By agreeing, you automatically grant permission for digital images or footage to be used for promotional or marketing purposes and/or social media. If you do not agree please advise the Inverell Eisteddfod Committee in writing prior to the eisteddfod.

<u>INVERELL EISTEDDFOD</u> — General Rules

Please read these rules carefully. Failure to comply with any of the rules and conditions may involve disqualification and withholding of prizes. All entries are received subject to these rules and conditions, which shall not be subject to any appeal at Law as being contrary to the spirit of friendly competition upon which the Eisteddfod is based. All entries are accepted under these rules and conditions, which are not open to legal appeal, as they are in keeping with the spirit of friendly competition that the Eisteddfod upholds.

- Age of competitor is recognised as at 31 December 2024. (Proof of age may be required).
- No entry will be accepted unless full entry fees are received. No entry will be accepted via email, all entries must go through comps online (www.comps-online.com.au). Entries are final upon submission, and no refunds will be issued. This ensures that the administration and planning of the event can proceed smoothly and as scheduled.
- Competitors must be present to perform in the order listed in the official program. No competitor will be permitted to compete outside their scheduled time.
- The Committee reserves the right to modify the program at any time, including changing the order of competitors.
- Competitors must be present at the beginning of the session as withdrawals may alter the order and anticipated time of a performance. It is unwise to anticipate exact performance times.
- Competitors may only enter their own age group, except in due, trio, group or open sections.
 Additionally any competitor can enter an open section, provided the work meets open standard but must perform a different routine than age section.
- Solo competitors may compete only once in any section. Performers may perform more than once in
 duos or trios but NOT consisting of identical competitors in any one section and in no more than 2
 duo/trios in that section. All names must be shown on the entry form or entries will not be accepted.
 Substitute partners will not be permitted.
- Competitors are not permitted to present the same item, or variation thereof, within the same
 discipline of the current Eisteddfod. The <u>ONLY</u> exception to this rule is in the Contemporary Dance
 Championship.
- No prompting or assistance of any kind is allowed during performance. Parents setting up props on stage must leave the backstage area before their child's performance begins, unless required for prop assistance during routine. Teachers will only be allowed backstage at the request of the announcer or if they are supporting a group/soloist aged 8 years and under.
- Parents setting up props on the stage must leave the backstage area prior to the commencement of their child's item. Teachers will only be permitted backstage at the request of the Chairperson, or a member of the Committee or or if they are supporting a group or soloist aged 8 years and under.
 Teachers, parents or siblings are not to be on stage with dancers including Baby Dance Sections.
- A group section is defined as four (4) or more competitors, players, or actors.
- In duo/trio sections, an individual may participate with different partners, with a maximum of two entries allowed per section. All names must be listed on the entry form; otherwise, the entries will not be accepted. If a competitor is unable to perform substitutes are not permitted.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor and/or parent to enter the correct section numbers when entering online. The Committee accepts no responsibility for entries received with incorrect information.
- The Committee has has the right to alter or amend the program in any way at any time, to refuse registration, cancel any registration or cancel any section where entry numbers are insufficient. To enhance the competition, sections may be combined as deemed appropriate by the committee.

INVERELL EISTEDDFOD - General rules continued

- The Adjudicator has the authority to divide, reduce, or withdraw prizes in any section if the performances do not meet the required standard of quality..
- Communication with the Adjudicator, whether in person, via text, or email, by teachers, competitors, or parents during the competition is strictly forbidden. This rule is enforced to ensure fairness and impartiality. Any violation of this rule will lead to immediate disqualification from the competition
- If, due to unforeseen circumstances, the Adjudicator is unable to fulfill their duties, the Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute.
- No entries will be accepted from any person who is or has been a pupil of the Adjudicator for that discipline within the six (6) months preceding the Eisteddfod.
- Protests, if any, are to be lodged with a Committee member within 30 minutes of the completion of the section concerned. A fee of \$50 must accompany all protests and will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous or unfounded. The decision of the Committee in all questions or disputes arising out of, or not provided for in, these rules SHALL BE FINAL.
- Teachers of the various arts are permitted to enter Open Sections.
- All dance music files and vocal backing tracks, (not sheet music) must be uploaded via 'Music Uploads' (www.musicuploads.com.au). The Inverell Eisteddfod Society will take no responsibility for incorrect labelling or late submission of music. All enquiries should go through 'Music Uploads'. A backup copy of music must be available on USB at the eisteddfod incase of any issues with music playing
- The use of offensive language in any section of the competition is strictly prohibited and may result in disqualification. This includes language or content that is discriminatory, abusive, or otherwise ina ppropriate. The Committee is committed to maintaining a respectful and inclusive environment, and any breach of this standard will be taken seriously.
- Please be aware age-appropriate costumes and music must be adhered to or the competitor may be penalised by the adjudicator.
- Entries will only be accepted if full entry fees are received. No entries will be accepted via email: all
 entries must be made through Comps Online (www.compsonline.com.au)
- Entries are final upon submission, and no refunds will be issued. This ensures that the administration and planning of the event can proceed smoothly and as scheduled.
- Entrants, volunteers, and members are advised that the Inverell Eisteddfod Society holds public liability insurance, which does not fully cover injuries to performers. It is recommended that individuals or schools secure adequate insurance coverage for participation, as entry is at their own risk. While the Society will exercise reasonable care, it cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage to items, including books, papers, props, costumes, instruments, or personal possessions.
- Local Competitor refers to competitors who reside within the Inverell Shire Local Government area.
- Perpetual Awards: All perpetual trophies/awards not identified as 'local' will be open to all competitors eligible to be awarded by the Adjudicator
- In some cases COMBINED EVENTS may be held grouping otherwise unviable performances together to enable a competitive event.

INVERELL EISTEDDFOD - General Rules continued

- Championships: Items performed during the Eisteddfod may NOT be repeated in the Championship section unless stipulated. Championships will be run regardless of the number of entries received and will be awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator, To enhance the competition, championships may be combined as deemed appropriate by the committee.
- Failure to comply wholly or partly with any of the rules or conditions may result in disqualification or the
 withholding of prizes. The decision of the committee on any question or dispute shall be absolutely final.
 The committee shall decide any matter not covered by the rules or conditions and their decision is final.
- The Inverell Eisteddfod Committee is not liable for any copyright infringements related to the submission of photocopies or the use of recorded music. Entrants should be aware of the APRA/ AMCOS copyright rules. For further information on copyright, please contact OneMusic Australia at www.onemusic.com.au or email hello@onemusic.com.au. It is essential that all competitors and teachers understand their responsibilities under the Australian Copyright Act 1968.
- **NEW RULE**—Each registered studio with participating students is eligible for two Teacher Passes, granting free entry to all sections. Teachers should email the convenor of their respective discipline to arrange the passes, which must be signed by the teacher. These passes are non-transferable and may not be used by other spectators.
- Adjudicators' reports will be provided to each competitor as a voice critique, accessible via Music Uploads at the end of each session.
- Courtesy is expected of the audience during any Eisteddfod performance. Audience members may be asked to leave the auditorium if they disturb a performance. Please note that while applause is most welcome at the end of the performance, we ask that you refrain from whistling, calling out and stamping and moving around during a performance,
- Programs will be emailed. No programs will be printed and posted.
- Video and Photography for solo & duo events can be captured from the designated table. only You
 must first register at the secretary's table to use this area. No videoing of school groups is
 permitted due to Child Protection Laws. Please refer to Secretary's Table for information associated
 with filming.
- The Society reserves the right to record, film,, broadcast, telecast, videotape, or photograph any entrant, performance, or event during the Eisteddfod without prior notification, except for schools that provide a NO MEDIA RELEASE. By submitting an entry, entrants grant permission for the Society to use their images for publicity or promotional purposes.
- Please return perpetual trophies, engraved and cleaned, to Trophy Coordinator Kym Foley by 30th April, 2025
- ARTS FOR ALL sections are open to intellectually or physically limited competitors. Competitors may have someone prompt them with their item.

RULES SPECIFIC TO DANCE

Please also read General Rules

- In Dance Sections, vocal backing is not permitted in the vocal section of any Song & Dance item. Some newer backing tapes may have fragments of added harmonization, which is acceptable.
- Plain coloured, unadorned leotards are to be worn for all Dance Improvisation Sections.
- ACRO: We support creativity and expression in dance and understand it is a constantly evolving art form, however in dance sections other than Acro a limited number of Acro/Gymnastic tricks are permissible, and while tricks are fun to watch we expect the routine will primarily be a dance routine with the focus being dance technique and choreography. An Acro/Gymnastics trick is defined as movements that pass through or stop at a fully inverted (upside down) position with both feet off the floor (the torso passing or stopping directly over the top of one's head/shoulders) e.g. Walkovers, Round offs, Front/Side Aerials,, Handsprings etc. The Adjudicator will decide on the day, the value of any content of the routine. All Acro routines are performed at the competitor's own risk
- Commencing with the wrong music will be tolerated, provided the dancer has not begun the routine. If a competitor has a memory lapse and runs offstage, they will be permitted to attempt their routine again at the end of the section if time permits, and at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee for a critique only. Prompting is not permitted.
- Group registrations must be entered in the oldest competitor's age group.
- The use of costume, song lyrics, subject matter or actions that are not regarded as acceptable in a
 family group is prohibited, and will result in the disqualification of the competitor at the
 Adjudicator's discretion. This also relates to an appropriate performance.
- Tights MUST be worn under costumes, for all routines.
- Tap Shoes—screws must be well secured and not protrude from the tap plate. This will damage the venue floor and stage.
- TAP SHOES MUST NOT BE WORN IN DRESSING ROOMS AND MUST BE CARRIED TO AND FROM THE STAGE STUDENTS MUST WEAR SHOES TO WALK TO STAGE AREA.
- Studio heads and teachers must adhere to Safe Dance Practices.
- Props must be limited to ensure they can be quickly placed on the stage. No props that cause debris ie. Talc powder, confetti, glitter or popping of balloons is permitted.
- ARTS FOR ALL sections are open to intellectually or physically limited competitors. Competitors
 may have someone prompt them with their item.
- All music files and vocal backing tracks, (not sheet music) must be uploaded via 'Music
 Uploads' (www.musicuploads.com.au). The Inverell Eisteddfod Society will take no responsibility for
 incorrect labelling or late submission of music. All enquiries should go through 'Music Uploads'. A
 backup copy of music must be available on USB at the eisteddfod incase of any issues with music
 playing

School Age Classification

In all sections with age restrictions specified as "Secondary School Age" no competitor may be of an age greater than that generally considered normal for secondary schooling. A small proportion of the players may be of younger age than specified. Same ruling applies to the age restriction "Primary School Age".

Dance Genre Description

CLASSICAL BALLET: Must include Classical steps and demonstrate ballet technique. Variations from classical repertoire are not permitted.

DEMI CHARACTER: Based on classical ballet technique. Must portray an age-appropriate story, clearly transmitting an emotion and story line. Variations from classical repertoire are not permitted.

LYRICAL: Varying dynamics and movement pathways with influences from Contemporary, Ballet and Jazz. Routine must demonstrate technique, expression, range of movement, strength and control utilising the lyrics or mood of the music

CONTEMPORARY: Incorporates abstract and extreme concepts. Contemporary dance should explore the dancer's body and range of movements. Using classical ballet technique but includes the use of the torso, floor and individual choreographic practices. Work should strive to be conceptual and not guided strongly by lyrics.

JAZZ: A routine utilising Jazz technique with appropriate music from any era of Jazz Dance and Performance. Selection of music should be suited to age of dancer. Acrobatic actions are performed at own risk.

HIP HOP: Routine that utilises influences from Hip Hop/Breakdance or evolved as part of Hip Hop culture.

TAP: Any style or tempo of Tap, must demonstrate rhythm, clarity, expression, light and shade, musicality and technique. Tap music accompaniment can include vocals.

SONG & DANCE: Routine must contain an even amount of both singing and dancing. Vocal backing is not permitted in any portion of any song and dance performance. Selection of song should be suited to age of dancer. No microphone permitted.

NATIONAL CHARACTER: A folk or traditional national dance choreographed to appropriate music with costumes depicting the style of the chosen country.

NEO CLASSICAL: Incorporates elements of traditional ballet technique while embracing modern and abstract movement. Neo classical is to be performed on pointe.

ARTS FOR ALL: Sections are open to intellectually or physically limited competitors. Competitors may have someone prompt them with their item.

RULES SPECIFIC TO MUSIC

Please also read General Rules

- Backing tracks may be used to accompany competitors in all vocal sections including
 Championships. Backing tracks may comprise multiple instruments but must NOT contain lyric or vocal backing. Backing tracks should showcase but not overpower the competitor's performance
- Arts for All competitors ARE permitted vocal backing
- No microphones to be used by competitors in vocal sections
- The Committee does not provide an Official Accompanist. Competitors are responsible for providing their own accompanist. However, if this is not possible please contact the music coordinator for a list of local people prepared to act in this role.
- NOVICE sections are open to solo competitors who have not previously entered ANY music event in any Eisteddfod by the time of the closing date for entries in the current year.
- ADJUDICATOR'S COPY (IN RELATION TO MUSIC/SPEECH & DRAMA ENTRIES) Set Pieces The
 Adjudicator must work from an original. Own Choice If you own original music controlled by an
 OneMusic Australia Publisher, you may make a single photocopy for the use of the Adjudicator. The
 photocopy is made and used solely for the purpose of adjudication and must be clearly marked
 "Adjudication copy only". The Eisteddfod Committee destroys the copy upon completion of the
 adjudication. A copy of the OneMusic Australia "Performer's Declaration" (attachment A in the
 syllabus and included in the program) must be attached to the photocopy
- The Law of Copyright applies to the Eisteddfod.
- If not performing from memory, all competitors must perform from the original copy of music, poetry etc. Adjudicator's copies must be clearly marked with Section Number and Competitor's Number. A Copyright Declaration Form must be attached to each copy. These forms will be available with the Eisteddfod Program and at the Secretary's Table during the Eisteddfod. All photocopies will be destroyed at the completion of the adjudication. It is the responsibility of all performers to ensure that their performance is not in breach of copyright. - Time Limits. All Vocal Sections have a time limit of four (4) minutes, except for Open Choir sections where 2 songs are sung or where otherwise stated. Junior and Intermediate Championship Sections have a combined limit of eight (8) minutes. Senior and Open Championships have a combined limit of ten (10) minutes. These limits will be enforced. All Music sections are OWN CHOICE unless otherwise stated.
- MUSIC COPY FOR ADJUDICATOR. All competitors in instrumental and vocal sections are required to submit a copy of their music for the adjudicator. A full score must be provided, preferably with bar numbers—to be handed to the Sectretaries Table on arrival at the hall.
- SPEECH COPY FOR ADJUDICATOR All competitors in Speech own choice events are required to submit a copy of their piece for the adjudicator. This is to be handed to the Secretaries table on arrival at the hall.
- ARTS FOR ALL sections are open to intellectually or physically limited competitors. Competitors
 may have someone prompt them with their item.

RULES SPECIFIC TO SPEECH & DRAMA

Please also read General Rules

- SPEECH & DRAMA CHAMPIONSHIP Competitors must present, two (2), in any order, either Prose/ Verse/Dramatic Sketch. 10 minute time limit. Competitors in this section must also participate in at least two (2) other sections in the Speech & Drama Eisteddfod.
- ADJUDICATOR'S COPY (IN RELATION TO MUSIC/SPEECH & DRAMA ENTRIES) Set Pieces The
 Adjudicator must work from an original. Own Choice If you own original music controlled by an
 OneMusic Australia Publisher, you may make a single photocopy for the use of the Adjudicator. The
 photocopy is made and used solely for the purpose of adjudication and must be clearly marked
 "Adjudication copy only". The Eisteddfod Committee destroys the copy upon completion of the
 adjudication. A copy of the OneMusic Australia "Performer's Declaration" (attachment A in the
 syllabus and included in the program) must be attached to the photocopy
- The Law of Copyright applies to the Eisteddfod. - SPEECH COPY FOR ADJUDICATOR All competitors in Speech own choice events are required to submit a copy of their piece for the adjudicator. This is to be handed to the Secretaries table on arrival at the hall.
- The set works will be available for download on the Inverell Eisteddfod website. If you have difficulty with this or have no one who can download it for you please post a request to the Secretary, enclosing a stamped, self-addressed envelope and clear indication of what is needed.
- ARTS FOR ALL sections are open to intellectually or physically limited competitors. Competitors
 may have someone prompt them with their item.
- Speech improvisation—Present an improvised scene using speech and movement from a topic given by the adjudicator—Time limit: 4 minutes and 1 minute preparation time.

School Age' Classification

In all sections with age restrictions specified as "Secondary School Age" no competitor may be of an age greater than that generally considered normal for secondary schooling. A small proportion of the players may be of younger age than specified. Same ruling applies to the age restriction "Primary School Age".

Speech & Drama Section Definitions

Nursery Rhyme in Costume

A nursery rhyme is a traditional short rhyming song or poem that conveys a lesson or tells an amusing story.

Verse Speaking

A verse in any style (Australian, lyrical, light, etc.) is written in verse to be performed in front of an audience.

Sight Reading

The adjudicator will prepare a verse or prose to be given on the day of the eisteddfod. Entrants will be given a small amount of time to sight the reading before reading aloud for adjudication.

Prose Recital

An excerpt from a story, recited from memory. Prose is made up of sentences and paragraphs without any metrical (or rhyming).

Mime

A mime is a dramatic performance where a story is conveyed through movement and non-verbal dramatic elements. There is no talking or sound in mime. No props permitted.

Dramatised Group

A group drama performance from a short play or scene, combining multiple elements of drama. Costuming is optional. If not in costume, drama blacks to be worn. Small props are welcome.

Improvisation Entrant is given a topic and has 2 minutes to prepare an improvisation. No props or costumes are needed. A chair and a table will be provided as props if required. Drama blacks are to be worn.

Literary

This can include poetry, prose, or excerpts from plays

Dramatic Sketch

A short, scripted performance designed to showcase acting and dramatic skills.

Public Speaking

A speech prepared by the entrant in w;hich palm cards or notes may be used. Subject is own choice

Humerous or Nonsense item

Is a performance focused on delivering a comedic or light hearted piece of work. This can involve poetry, prose, or a short dramatic sketch that is designed to entertain through humour.
