# **GENERAL FESTIVAL REGULATIONS**

#### 1. GENERAL MANAGEMENT

- a) In these regulations, the word 'Committee', shall mean the Committee of the Murwillumbah Festival of Performing Arts Society Inc.
- b) The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- c) Programming positions will be strictly observed (unless changed by the Convenor).
- d) In Own Choice competitions, marks will be awarded for quality of selections.

#### 2. BREACH OF REGULATION

Any competitor deemed to be in breach of a section's regulations will be furnished with an Adjudicator's Report containing comments only.

#### 3. ENTRIES

- a) No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the full fee as per Schedule.
- b) Entries should be through Comps-Online. Please be sure that ALL particulars are provided.

#### 4. COMPETITIONS

- a) No competitor will be allowed to perform the same item in more than one section, unless otherwise stated.
- b) Due to time commitments or unnecessary repetition, the Adjudicator may 'ring off' a competitor before completion of the performance. This does not necessarily signify disapproval or rejection.
- c) All competitors in Championship Sections must enter and perform in their corresponding age or open sections. (Restricted sections not accepted.)
- d) Please keep Props to a MINIMUM and be sure they are able to be handled by the stage hands. All props to be removed from the precincts of the stage at the conclusion of each session.
- e) Persons required to manipulate props or to play music will be allowed in the stage wings, but only during the relative performance.
- f) Sections may be split or combined if warranted, at the discretion of the convener.
- g) The competition is open to amateurs only, not professionals or teachers. (A professional is defined as a person who earns a major part of his/her income from the practice of the art, or who uses the art as a primary means of livelihood.)
- h) Persons with disabilities are encouraged to enter the competitions. Please advise by email of any additional requirements or if wheelchair access to the stage is required.

#### 5. AGE

Age for competitors is listed in the individual regulations for each genre

#### 6. TIME LIMITS

- a) Time limits have been specified throughout this schedule. In fairness to all and in the interest of accurate programming, PLEASE COMPLY WITH THESE LIMITS. Should time limits be exceeded, the adjudicator may penalise.
- b) A timer will be used for the Festival.

#### 7. PRIZES

- a) The adjudicator's decision is final and he/she will have the power to withhold or divide prizes according to merit.
- b) The adjudicator may also be entitled to recommend the awarding of a second prize only, if the performance has not sufficient merit to carry first prize.

#### 8.PROTESTS

- a) Protests need to be lodged with the Convenor, in writing, within one hour after the completion of the relevant section and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00, which shall be forfeited if the protest is deemed to be unfounded.
- b) The decision of the Committee in all questions arising out of, or not provided for by these regulations, shall be final.
- c) 'Lack of knowledge' regarding Regulations will not be accepted as a bona fide reason for infringement of any Regulation.
- d) ALL competitors compete entirely at their own risk.

#### 9. PHOTOGRAPHY

- a) Flash photography is not allowed. For Dance, professional photographs and videos are available, at a reasonable cost.
- b) Photography is not allowed in the Dressing Rooms. The Committee has the right to remove any person who contravenes this direction.

#### **10. PETS**

Animals are not permitted in the Auditorium except for Guide Dogs and Assistance Dogs. In the case of Assistance Dogs, a Handler's Identity Card may be requested.

#### 11. REGULATIONS IN THE PROGRAMME

- a) The General Regulations and Competition Rules specific to each of the disciplines are printed in the SCHEDULE and most will not be repeated in the PROGRAMME.
- b) Make sure you read the General Regulations and Specific Regulations as changes may occur.

#### 12. PRAMS AND STROLLERS

Prams and Strollers are NOT permitted backstage, on the stairwells, or in the dressing room

#### 13. UNCLAIMED ITEMS / PROPERTY

- a) Lost property will be kept for 2 weeks and then given to charity.
- b) Unclaimed Adjudicator's Reports, Music CDs and USB sticks/drives will be kept until the completion of the Festival.

#### 14. UNAUTHORISED PERSONS

Unauthorised persons and parents are not to be backstage, or in the Announcer's area unless assisting with props.

#### 15. EFTPOS

EFTPOS is available at the auditorium, but NO cash out.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE TO TEACHERS AND PARENTS:

There are a number of changes this year so please check everything carefully.

Please note that once the Speech & Drama Programme has been finalised, no alterations or additions will be made, unless Committee error. Any changes on the day of performance are at the discretion of the Convenor. Check your entries thoroughly.

#### 1. AGE

Age for Speech and Drama is 1st January 2025

#### 2. COMPETITORS

- a) Competitors, please mark your name off at the front desk prior to your session.
- b) Copies of all 'Own Choice' material should be scanned and emailed as a PDF file to mfpa.speech1923@gmail.com a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the Festival with SECTION NUMBER and COMPETITOR NUMBER and NAME clearly marked in the TOP RIGHT HAND CORNER. It is suggested that a hard copy be brought by the competitor, as insurance against inadvertent loss.
- c) Unless otherwise stated, all pieces are to be performed from MEMORY.

#### 3. GUIDELINES FOR MATERIAL

- a) The selection must be of suitable length and difficulty for each age group.
- b) In choosing your selections, consideration should be given to the appropriateness of the material to the age and experience of the entrant and the boundaries of good taste. Please consider your audience.

#### 4. TIME LIMITS

- a) Time limits have been specified throughout this schedule. Should time limits be exceeded, the adjudicator may penalise.
- b) A timer will be used for the Festival.

Time limits are maximum times – selections may be shorter.

#### 5. COSTUMES AND PROPS

- a) Costumes are required for Drama Sections, including Shakespeare.
- b) Costumes are optional for 5 years and 6 Years in all sections.

c) Please keep props to a minimum and ensure they are capable of being handled by the Stage Hands.

#### 6. NOVICE HUMOROUS SECTIONS

- a) Novice Humorous Sections are for competitors who have never received a 1st, 2nd or 3nd place in any Speech & Drama Section of any eisteddfod or festival to date.
- b) Competitors in NOVICE HUMOROUS may also enter HUMOROUS but they must use a different poem.

#### 7. SIGHT READING AND IMPROVISATIONS

Improvisations will be provided by the Adjudicator.

8Yrs to 12Yrs = approximately 12 lines

13Yrs to 17Yrs = half page text

Improvisation title to be provided by the Adjudicator. Each competitor will be given an age appropriate preparation time off stage. A bell will be rung 30 seconds before finish time.

#### 8. VERSE SPEAKING

Verse Speaking is to be NON humorous

#### 9. DRAMA

Dramatisation from a Published or Devised piece assuming language, movement and dress of original character. Portray one character only.

#### 10. PROSE: A Selection from a novel.

- a) All Prose is to be memorised
- b) The selection may include narration, description and dialogue. It should be spoken in the story-telling style but should not be performed as a dramatic scene.

#### **11. MIME**

Mime costume, all black (No music allowed.)

#### 12. POEMS IN PAIRS

A poem recited by 2 people. Some unison work is required.

#### 13. GROUP DRAMA / POEM / MIME

Minimum of 3 performers, maximum of 10 performers in all age groups.

#### 14. ENTRY COST

Solos: \$8.00 per item

Duos: \$4.00 per item, per competitor

Groups: \$12.00 Choirs: \$15.00

J.J. Richards Scholarship: \$30.00

#### 15. AGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competitors must enter the following 4 sections to qualify for the J.J. Richards Age Championships.

Ages 7 to 14 Years: Verse Speaking, Prose, Drama, Mime.

Scholarship - 15 to 17 Years must enter six sections – Verse Speaking, Humorous Verse, Sight Reading, Memorised Prose, Drama and Mime

7 Years: \$20.00 plus trophy Runner Up: \$10.00

8 Years: \$25.00 plus trophy Runner Up: \$15.00

9 Years: \$25.00 plus trophy Runner Up: \$15.00

10 Years: \$30.00 plus trophy Runner Up: \$15.00

The adjudicator's decision is final. The Committee will not enter into correspondence regarding any outcome.

The scholarship should be awarded to the most outstanding performer.

It is recommended, but not required, that the scholarship be awarded to a senior student with overall excellence in 3 or more sections in the current Festival.

Each scholarship may only be awarded once to each awardee

15 Years to 20 Years, Amateur only.

Previous 1<sup>st</sup> place winners of this section are not eligible.

Competitors to present a **memorised**, **themed** and **linked** creative presentation of no longer than 15 minutes, which consists of 3 performances from the following

- · Lyric poem
- · Humorous poem or humorous prose
- · Drama
- · Mime

Own choice of theme. Costume, props, music and all genres optional.

Entry fee for this section is \$30.00.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR MATERIAL**

- 1. Please be considerate of your audience and stay within the boundaries of 'good taste', no expletives or unsavoury topics please
- 2. Pieces **MAY NOT** be repeated in other sections of the festival.
- 3. Unless there are four competitors in this section, the competition will be cancelled and entry fee refunded.

#### SCHOOL SECTIONS – CHORAL SPEAKING RULES AND GUIDELINES

Choral Speaking is the group interpretation of a poem or prose. The piece is spoken by the choir as a whole but solo and group voices may be included. Actions and gestures may be used if suggested by the piece.

ALL enquiries to Simone Wong or Michele Lourie Entry fee \$15.00 per choir.

- 1. Choirs must all be in school uniform but may have a hint of character (e.g., witch hat; shawl etc) Props are to be hand-held only.
- 2. Small school's choir section to be from schools with a maximum of 110 students. It may be multi-stage and can be own choice or an appropriate choice from the set poem sections
- 3. NO school bags to be taken into the auditorium. This will allow more room for students.
- 4. Choir Days: Primary and Kindergarten choirs will be held Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 and Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2025 Specific times to be advised

#### 5. Closing date for entries: 5th May 2025

Teachers accompanying choirs are to wear their school's name badge for free entry with their choir.
